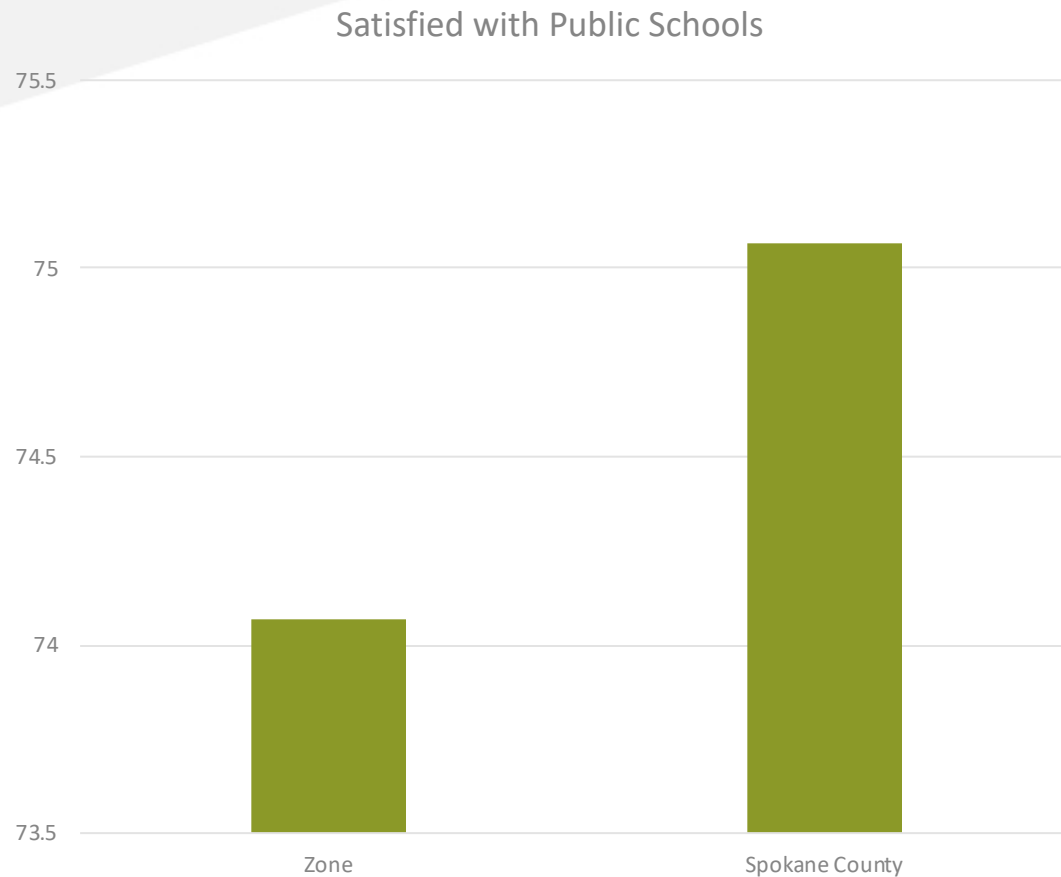

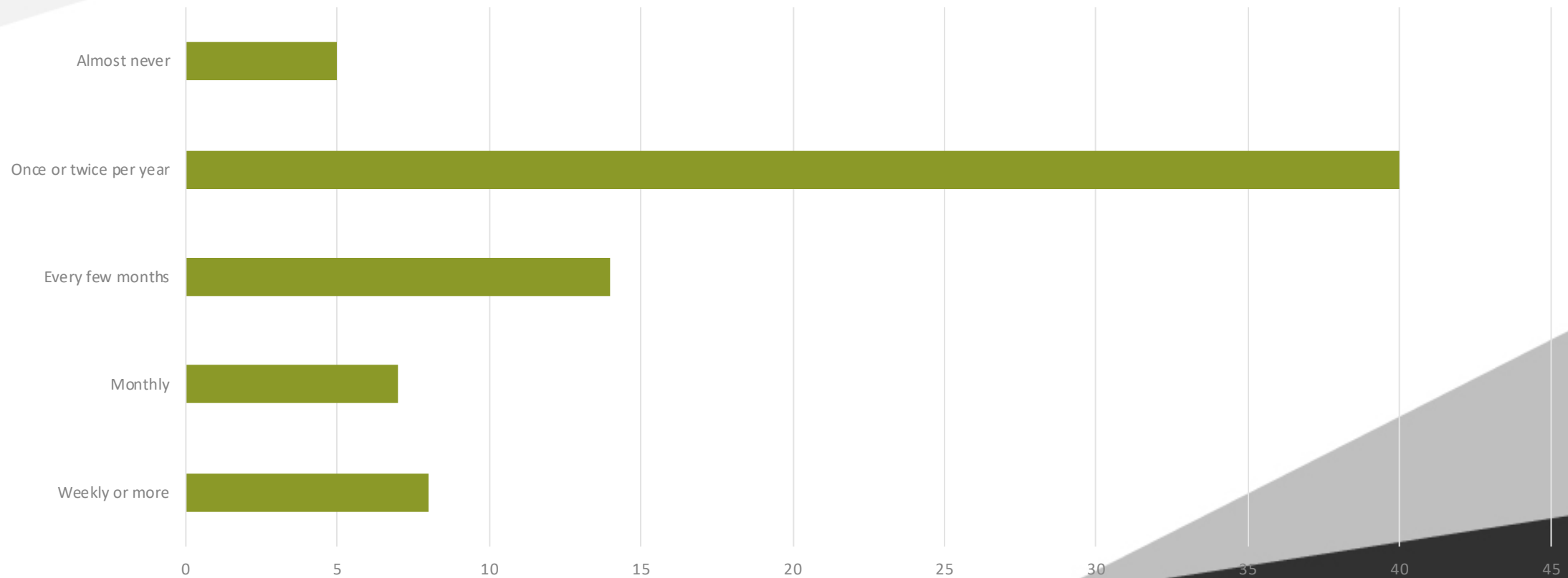

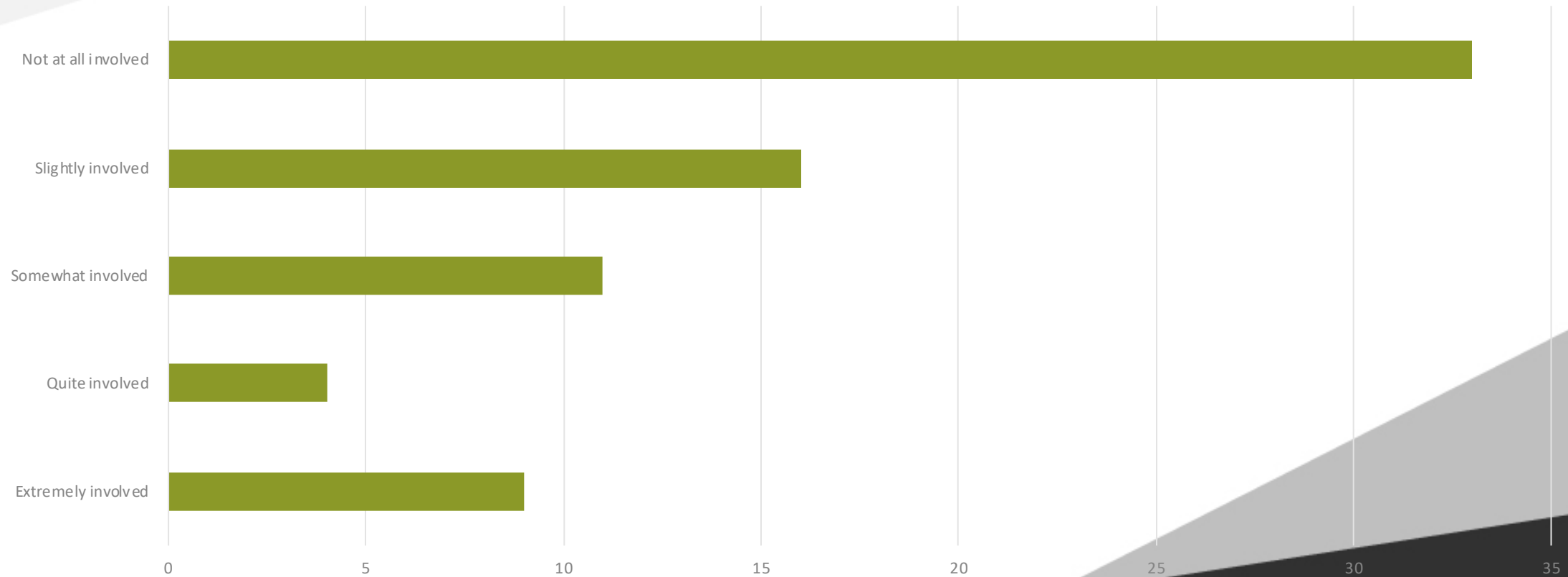

Parents: How often do you meet in person with teachers at your child's school?



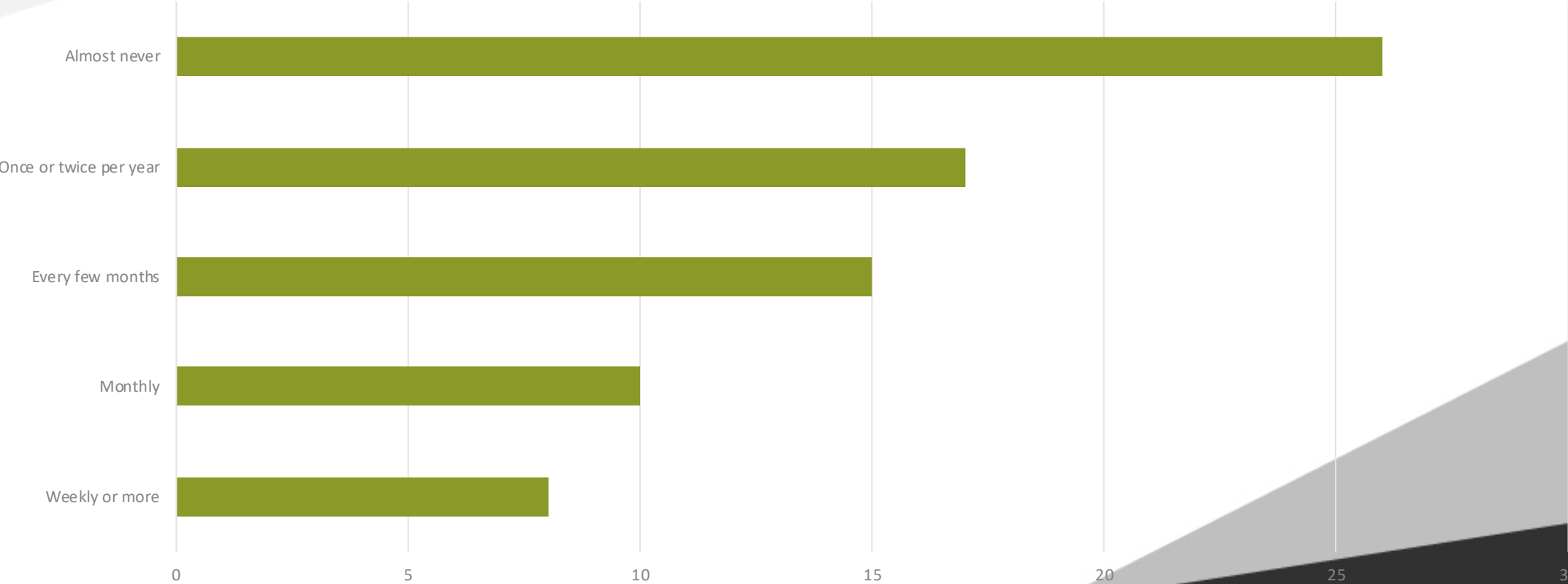

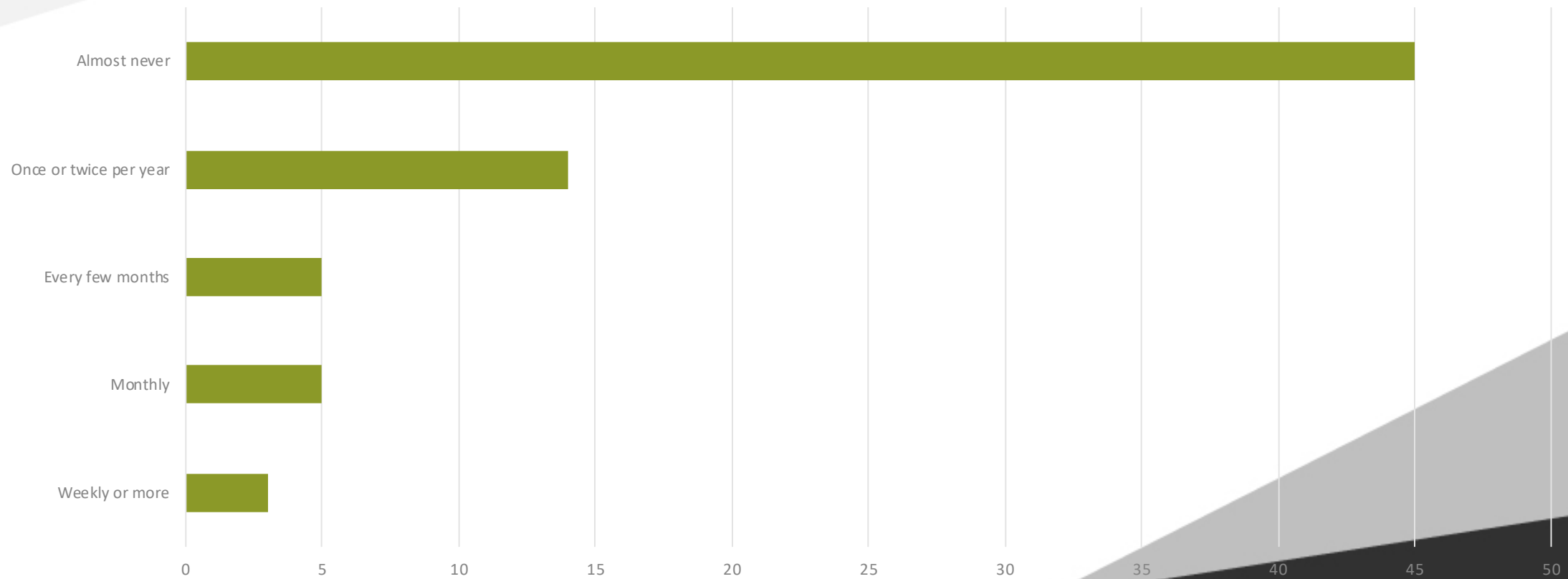
Parents: In the past year, how often have you discussed your child's school with other parents from the school?





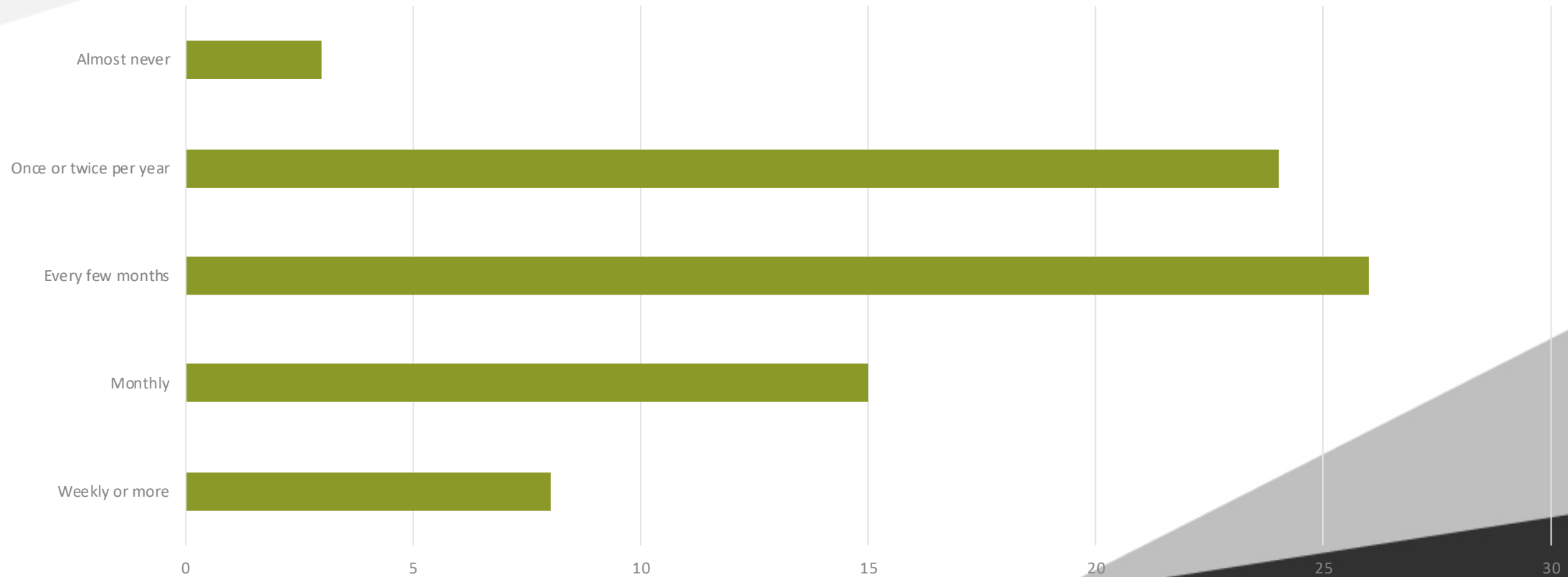

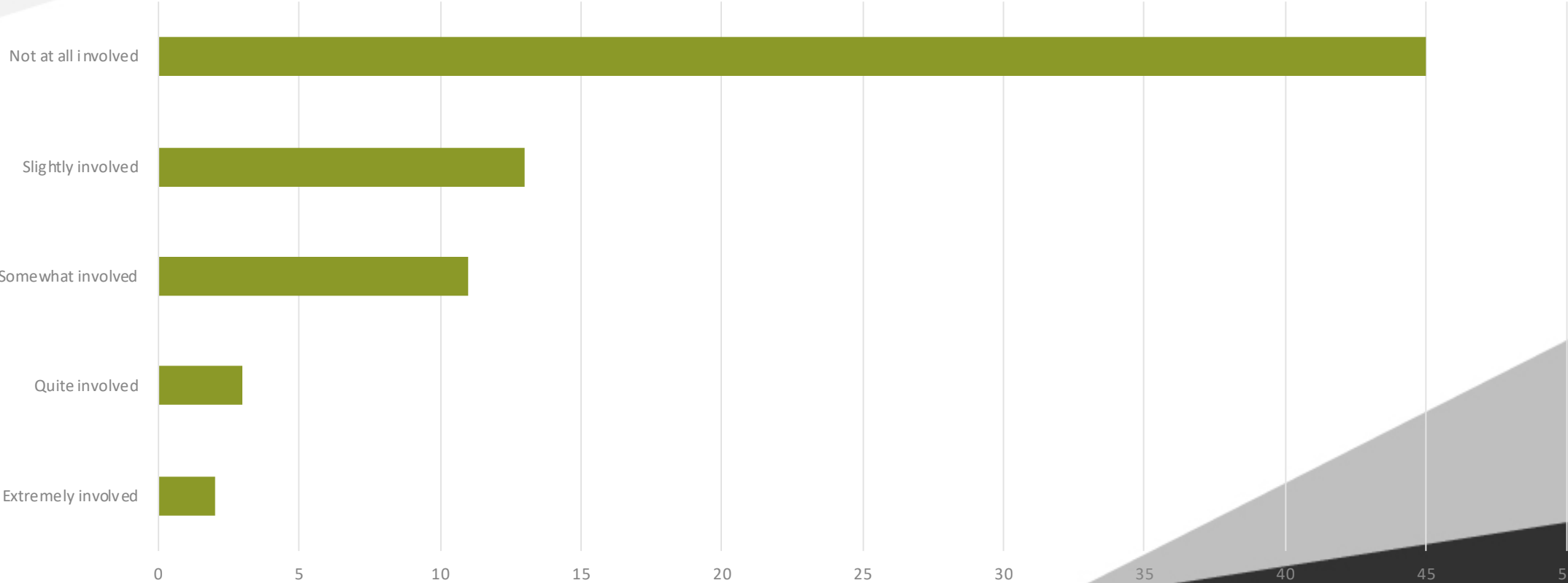

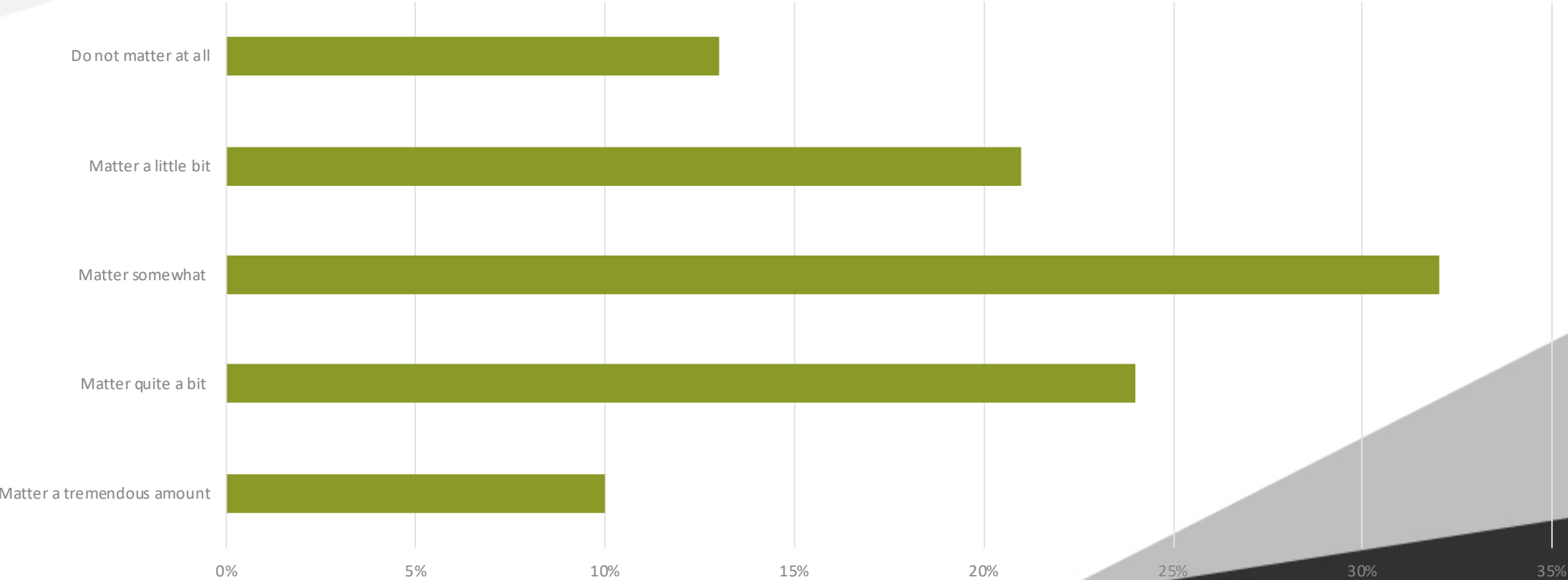

Students: How well do people at your school understand you as a person?



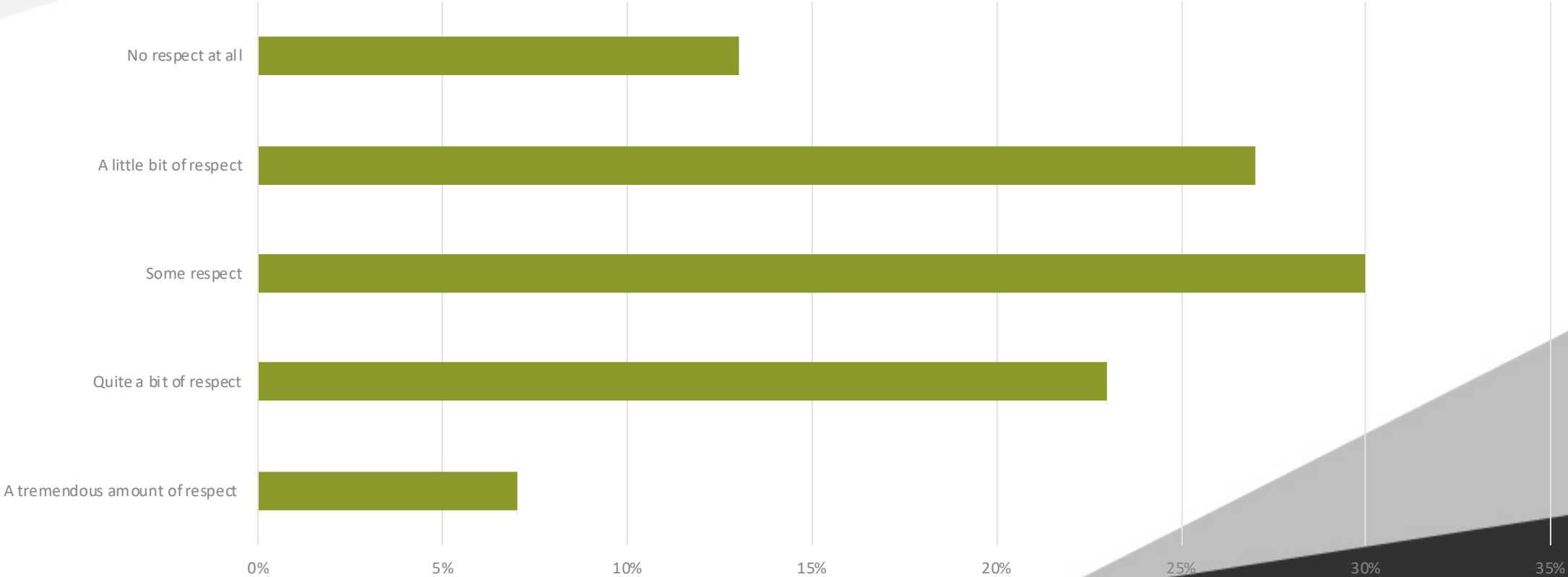

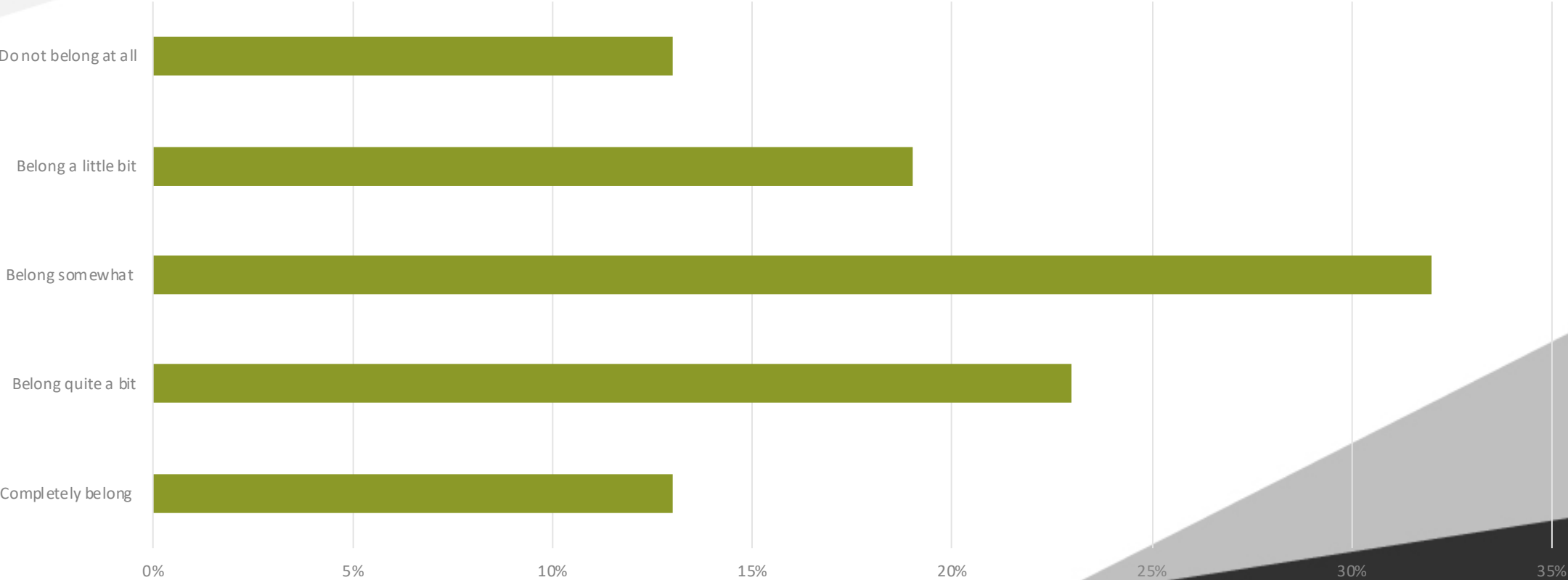

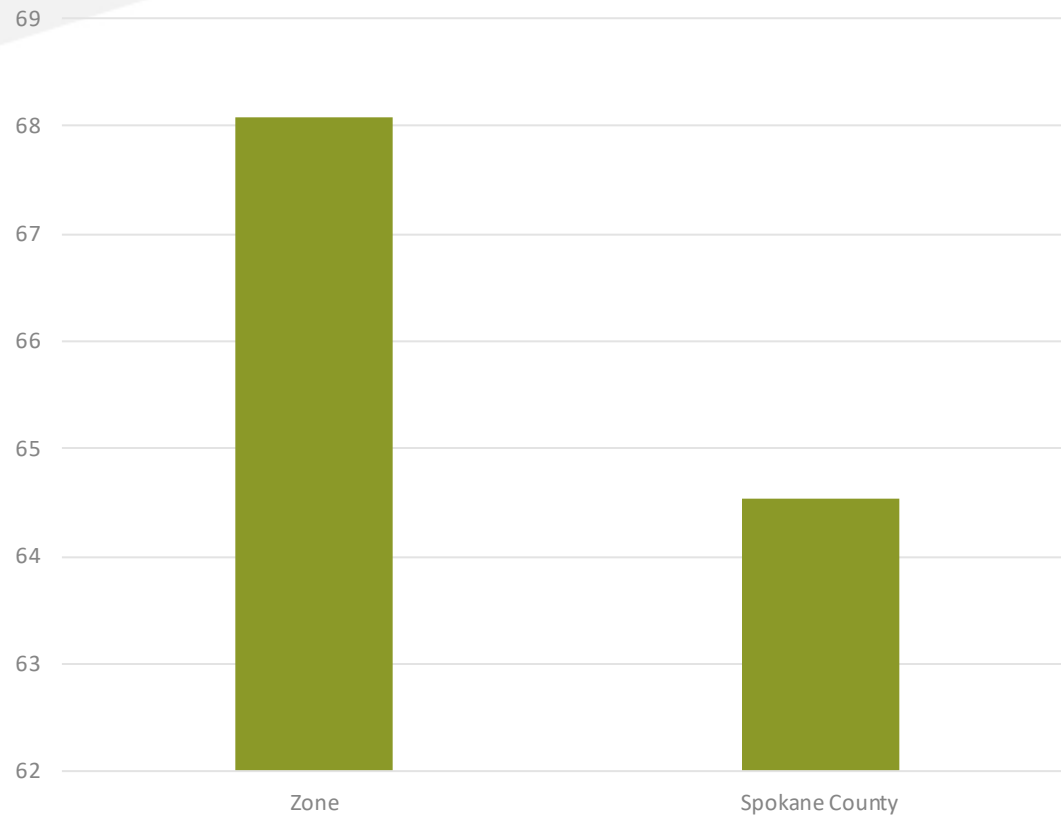

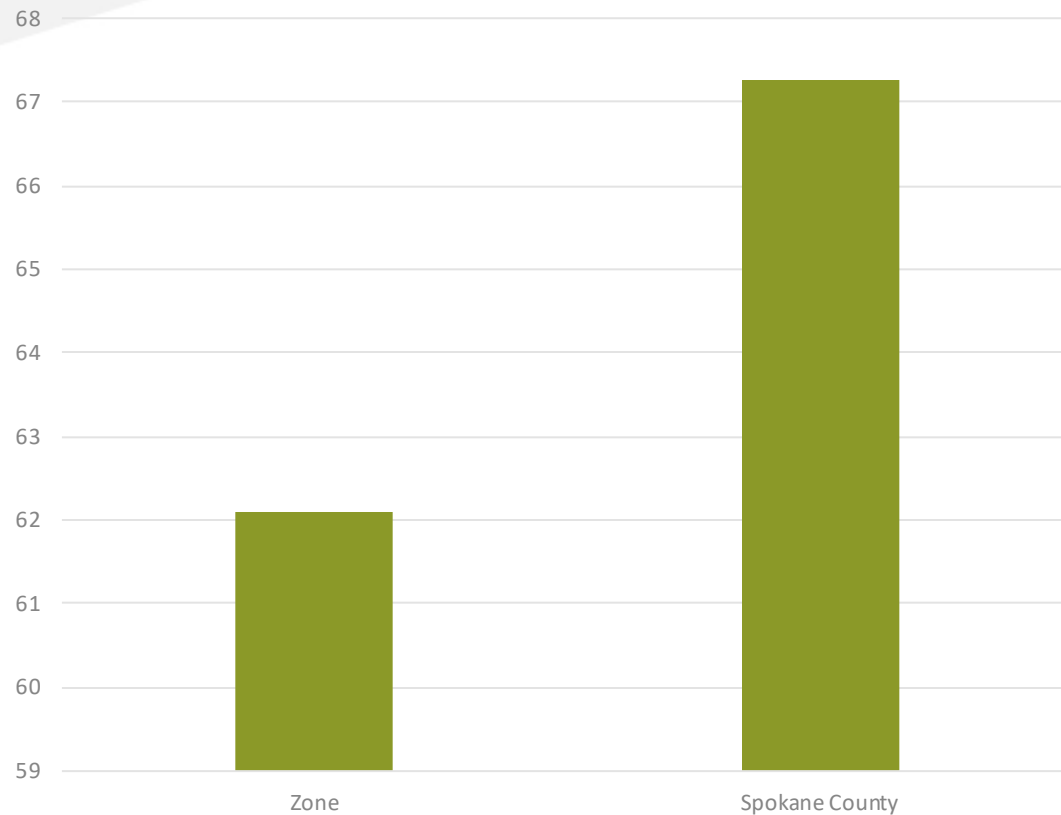

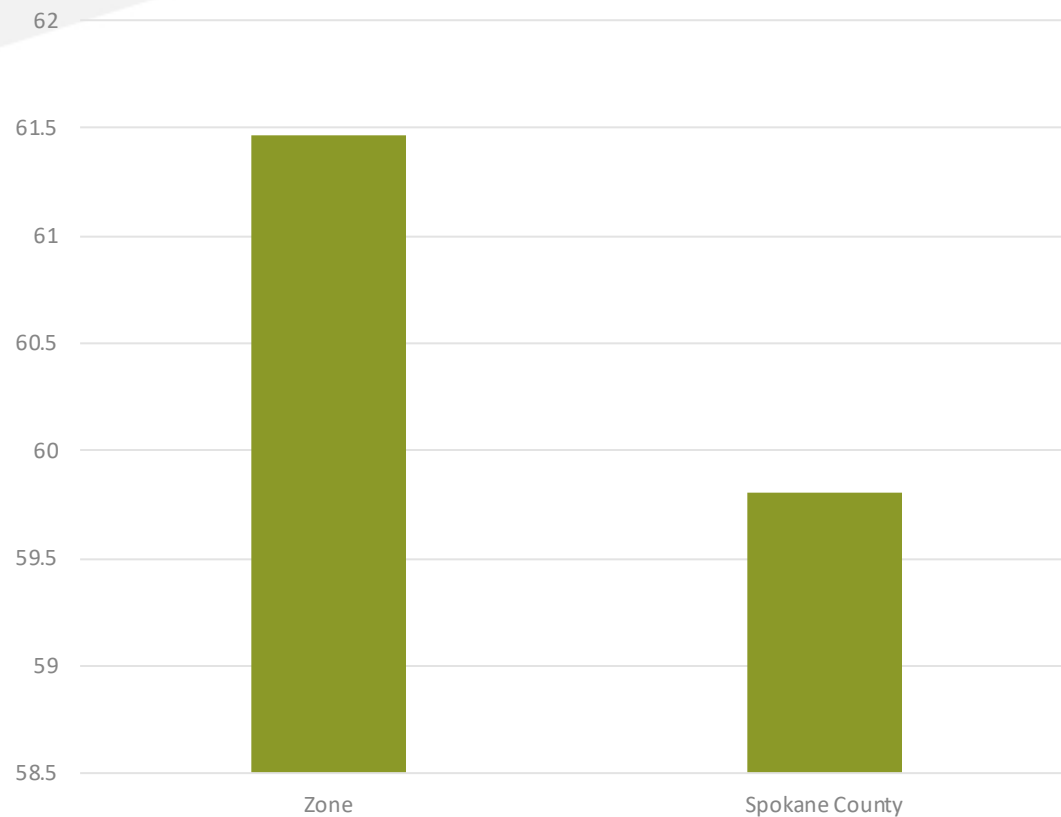

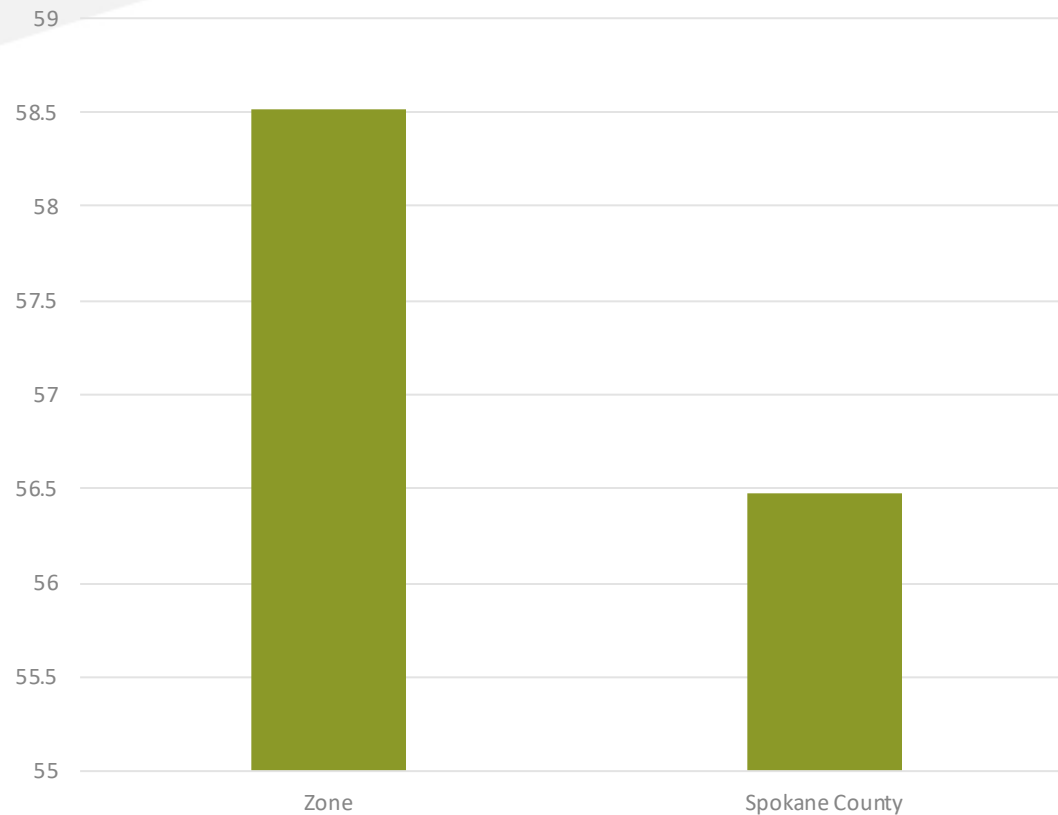

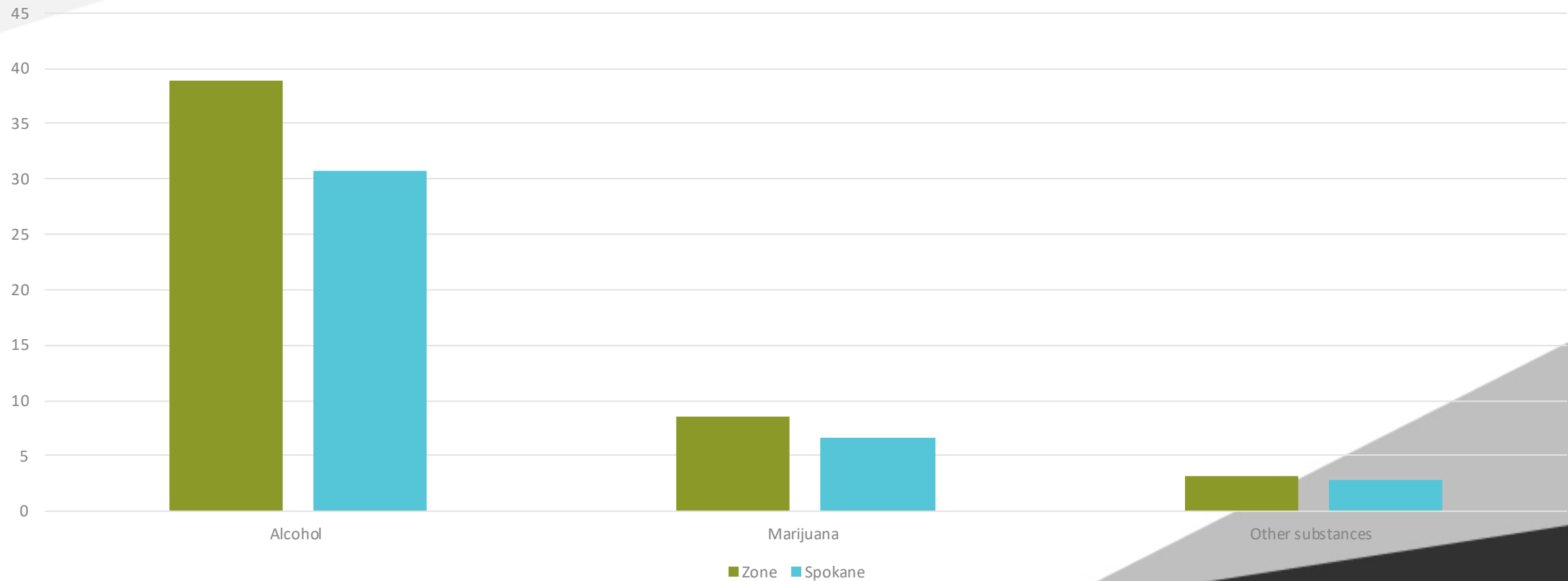

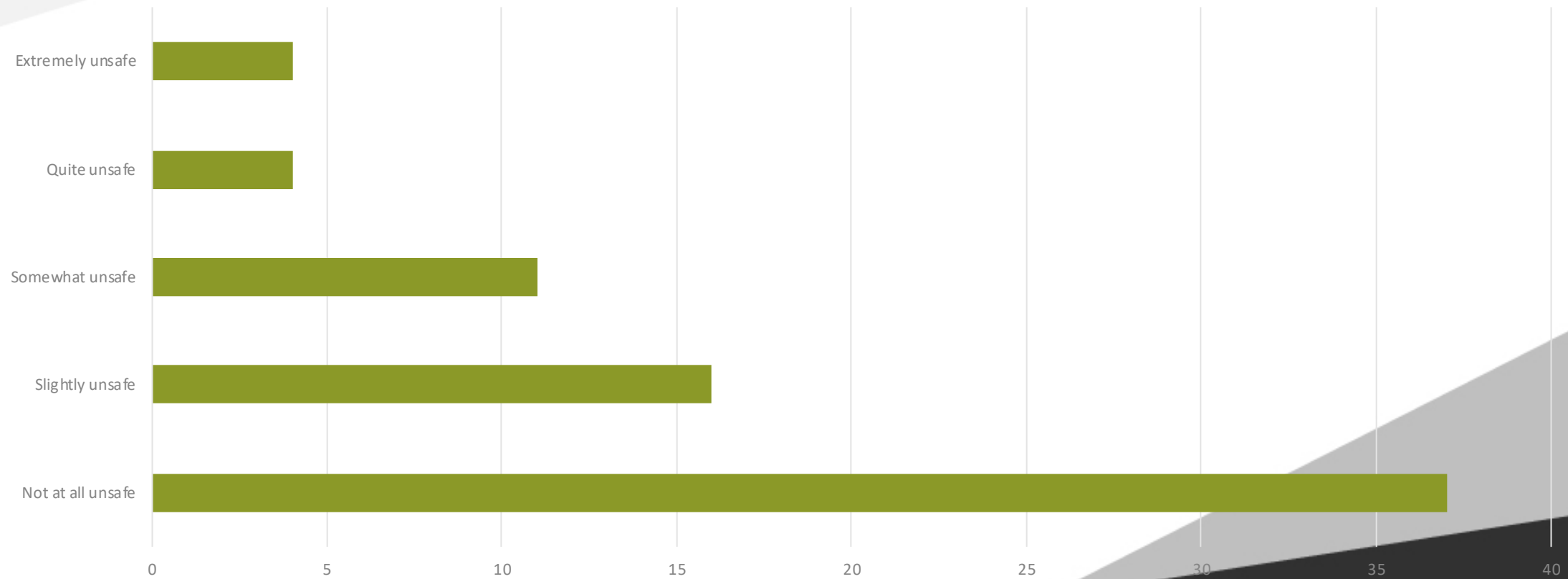
Parents: Likelihood Child Bullied Online





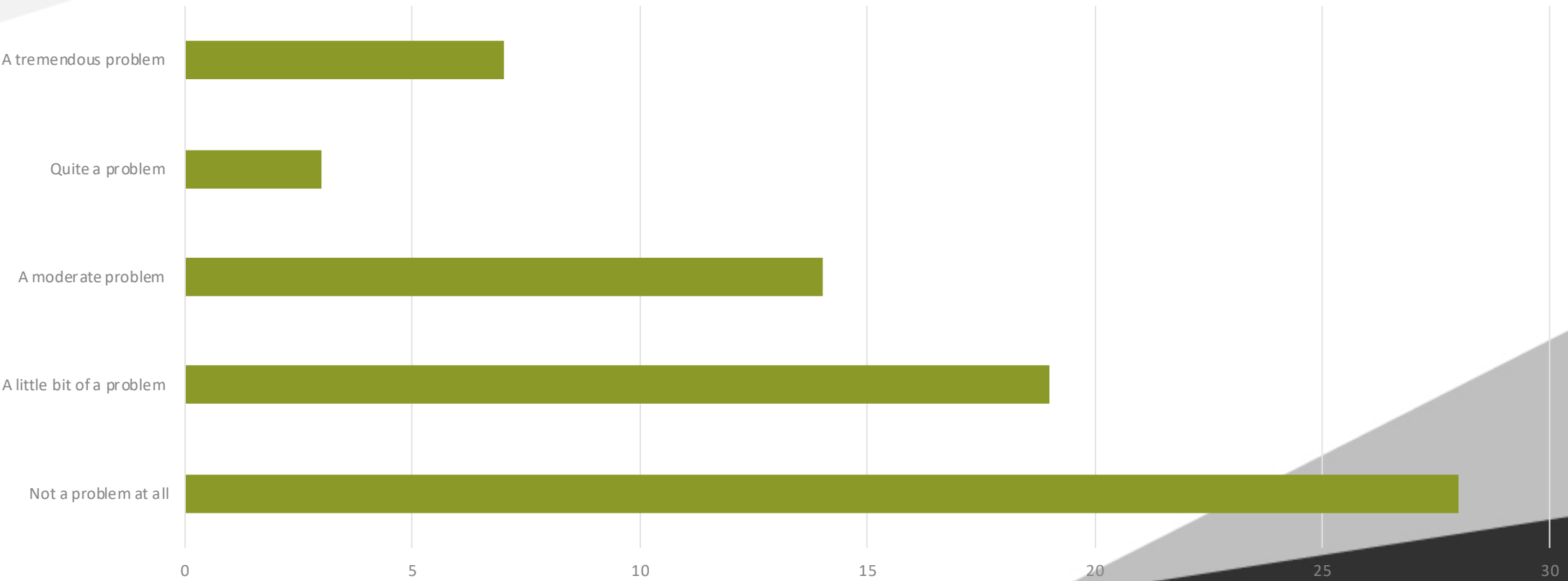

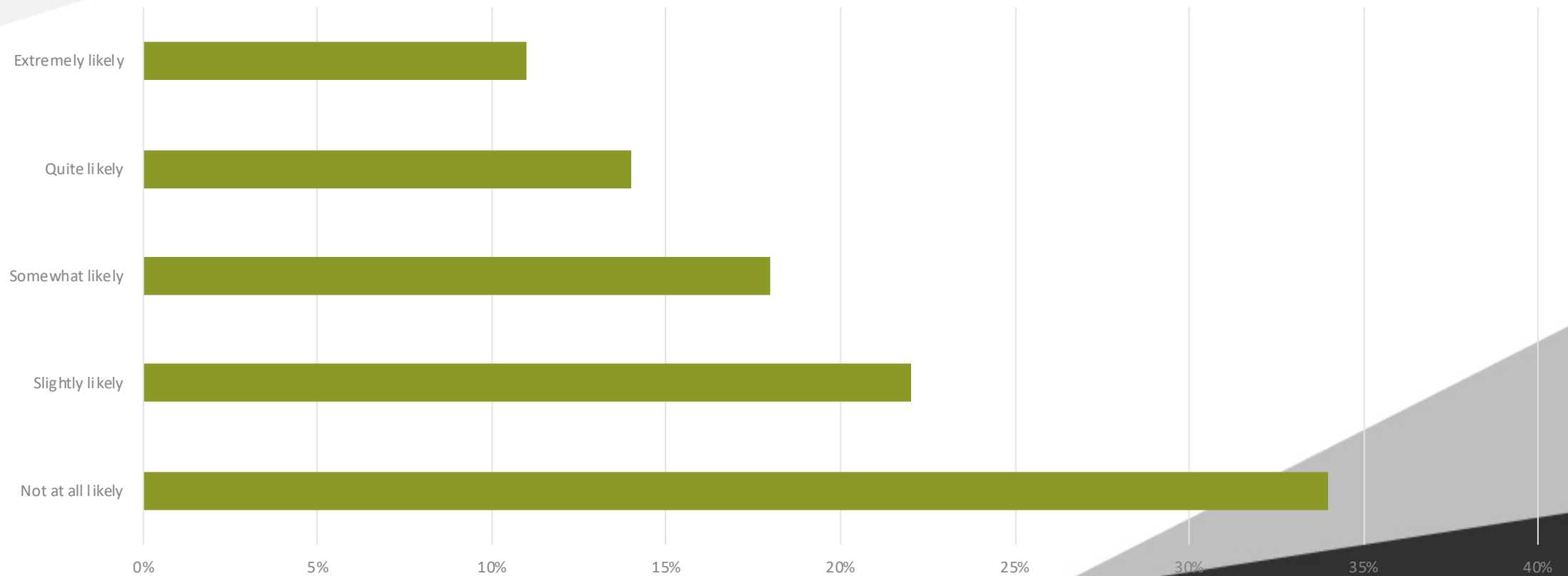
If a student is bullied in school, how difficult is it for him/ her to get help from an adult?



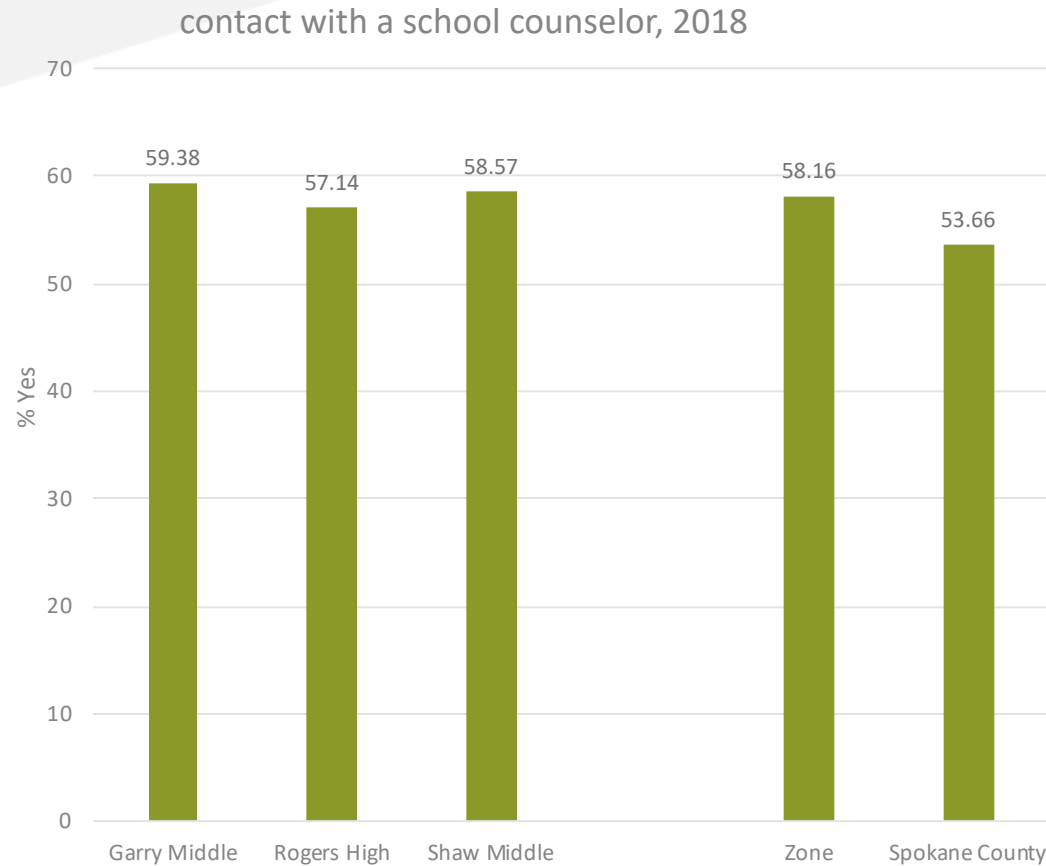

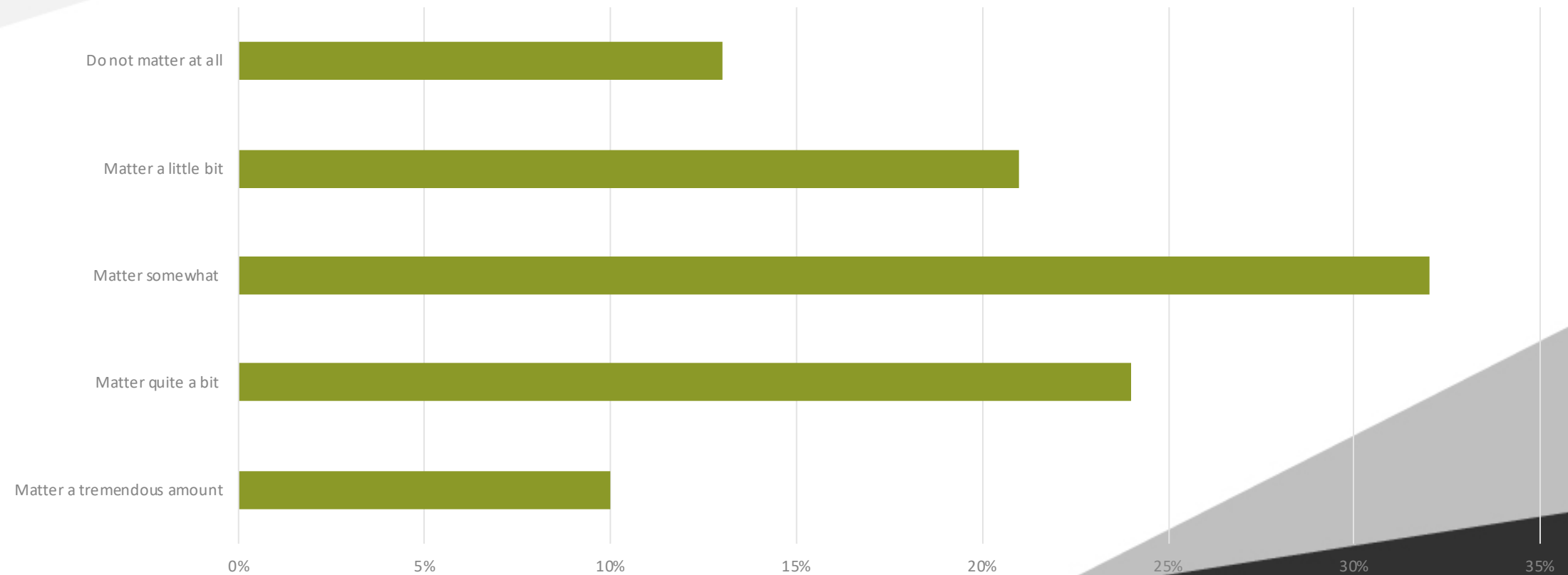

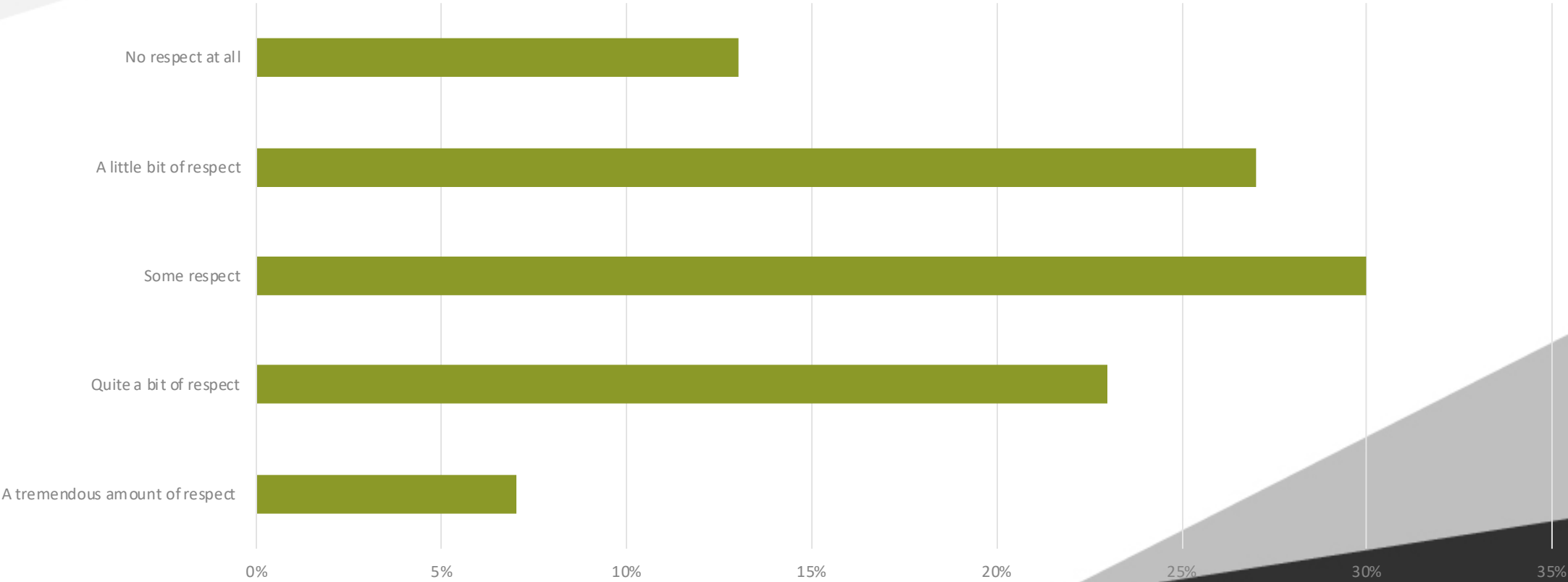

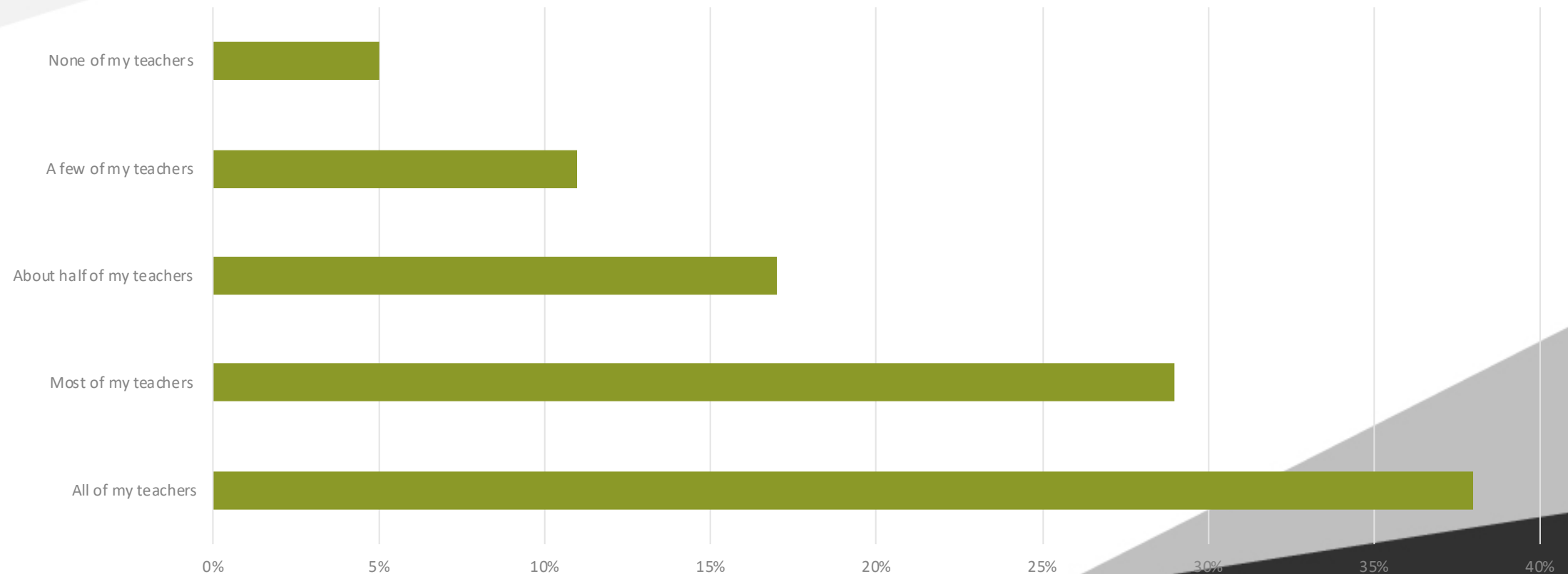

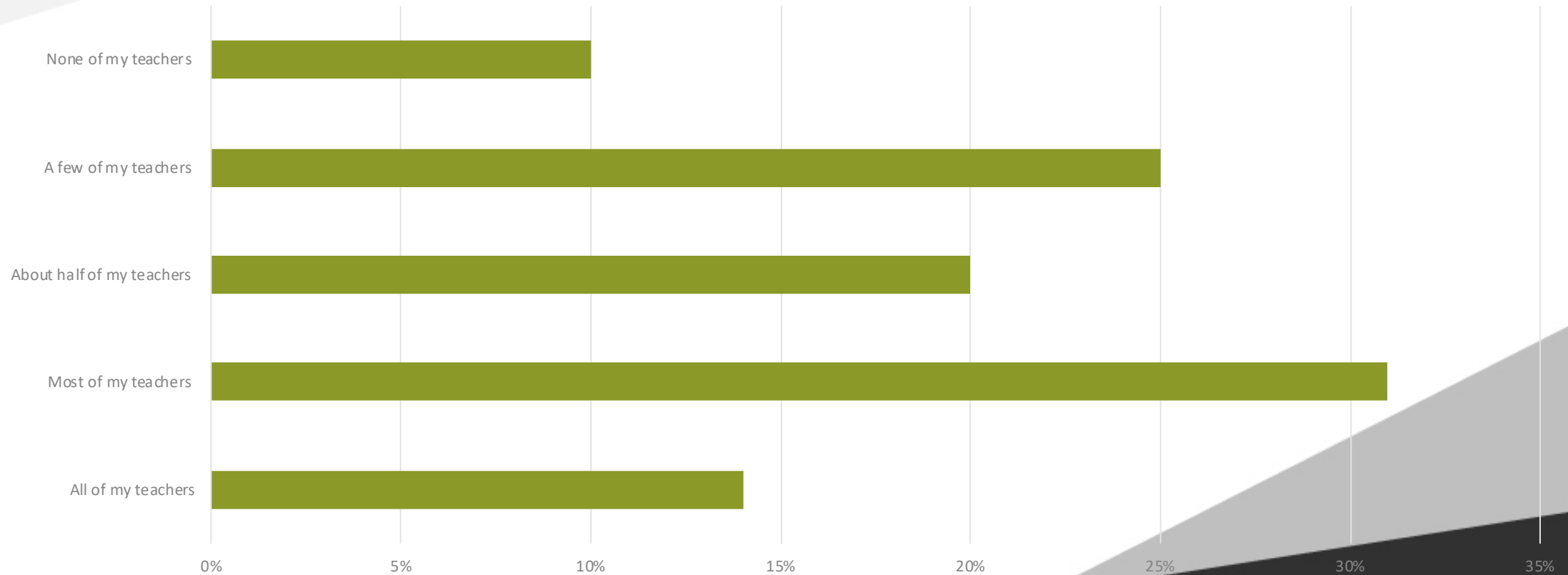

Students: How many of your teachers are respectful towards you?



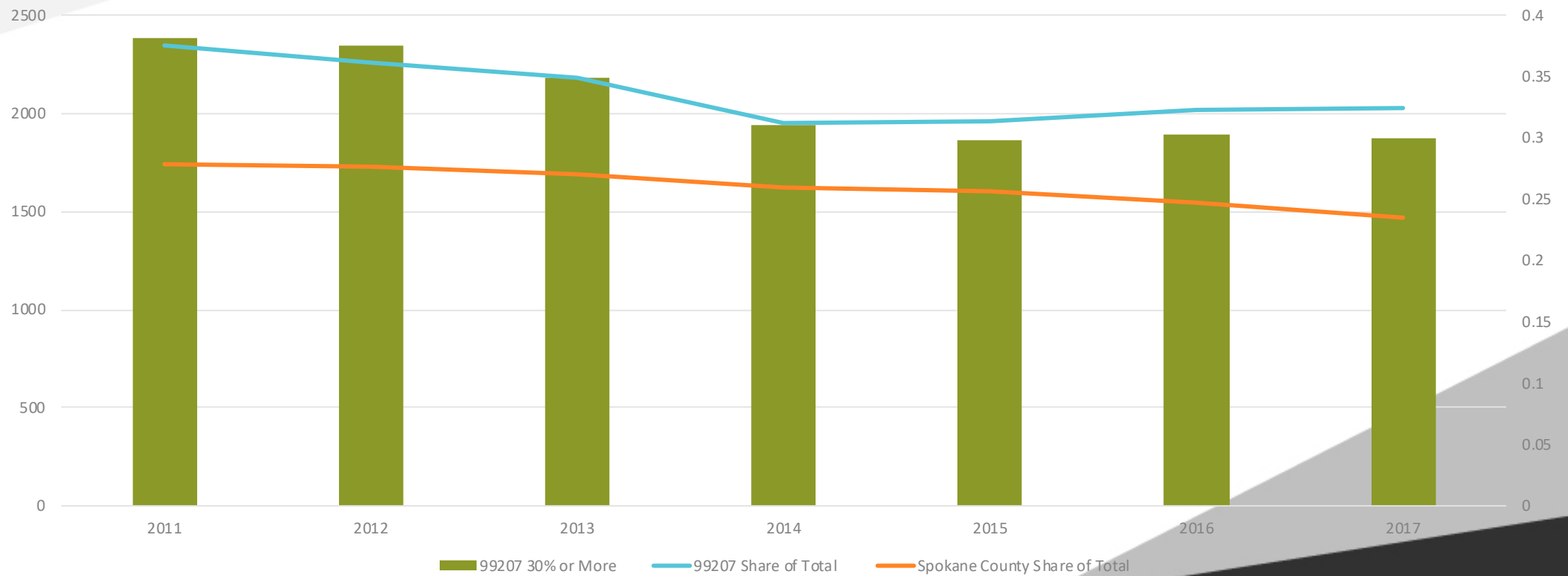

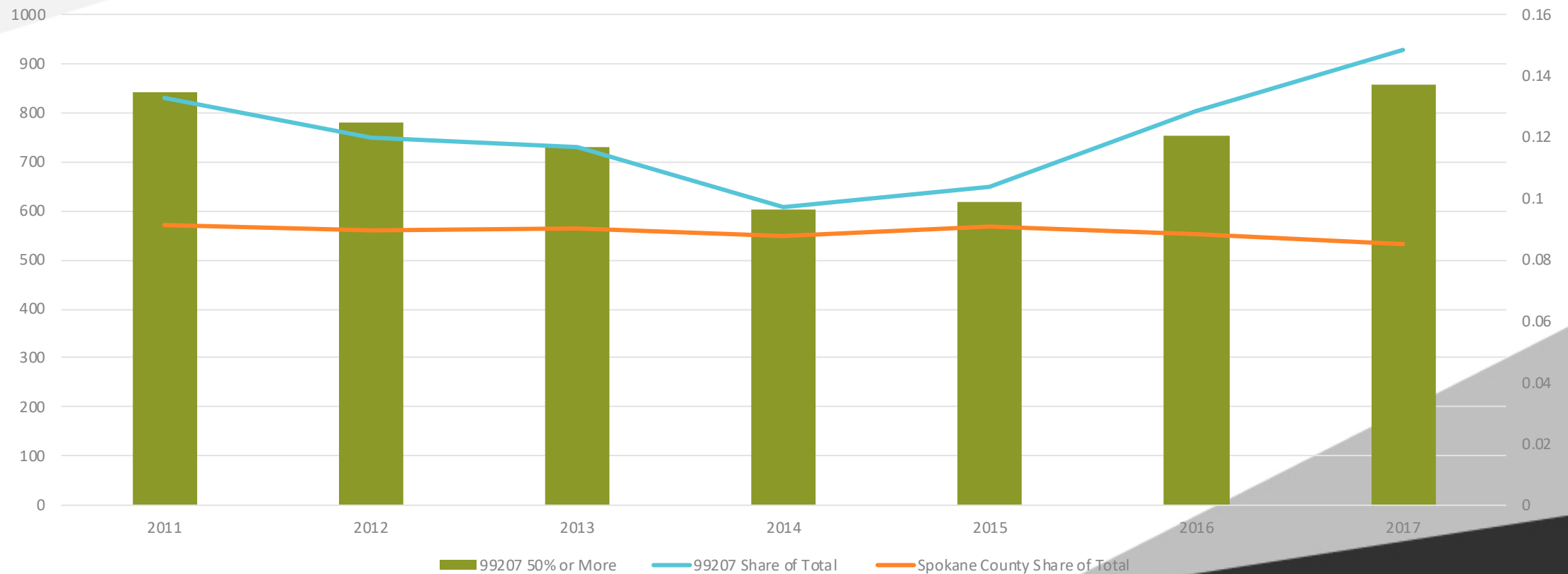

Total and Share of Homeowners Paying 30% or More of Their Household Income for Shelter Costs



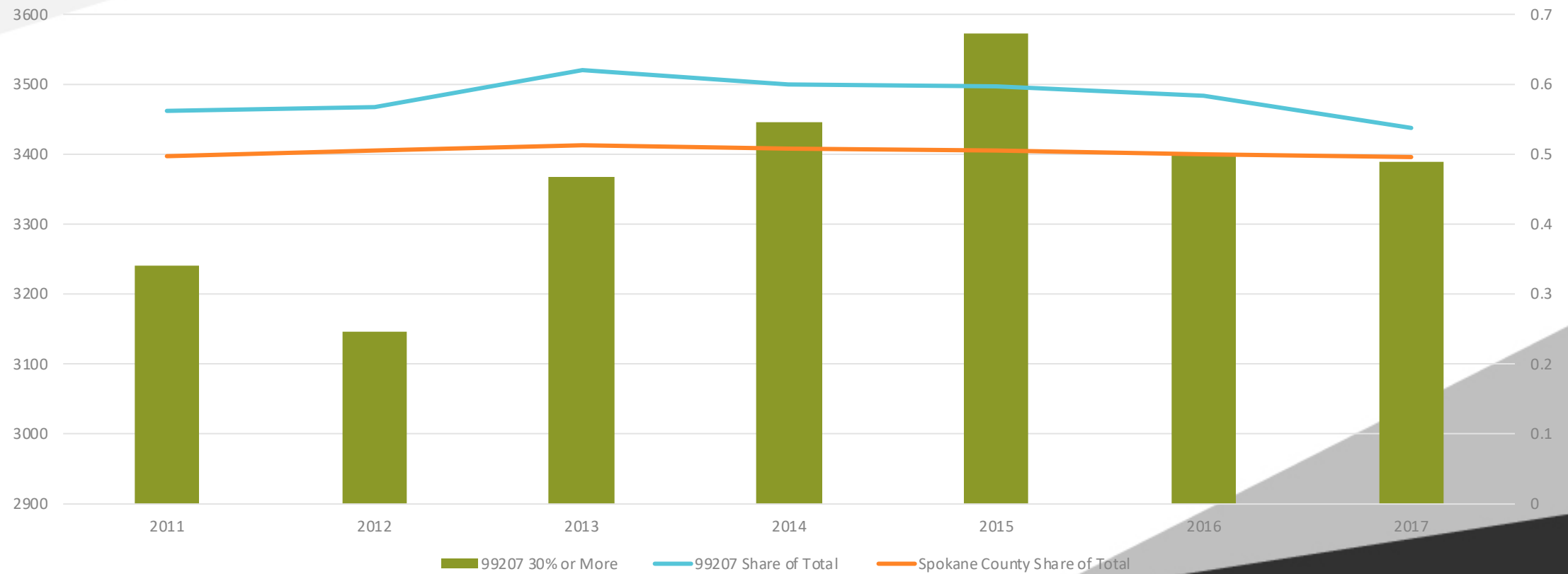

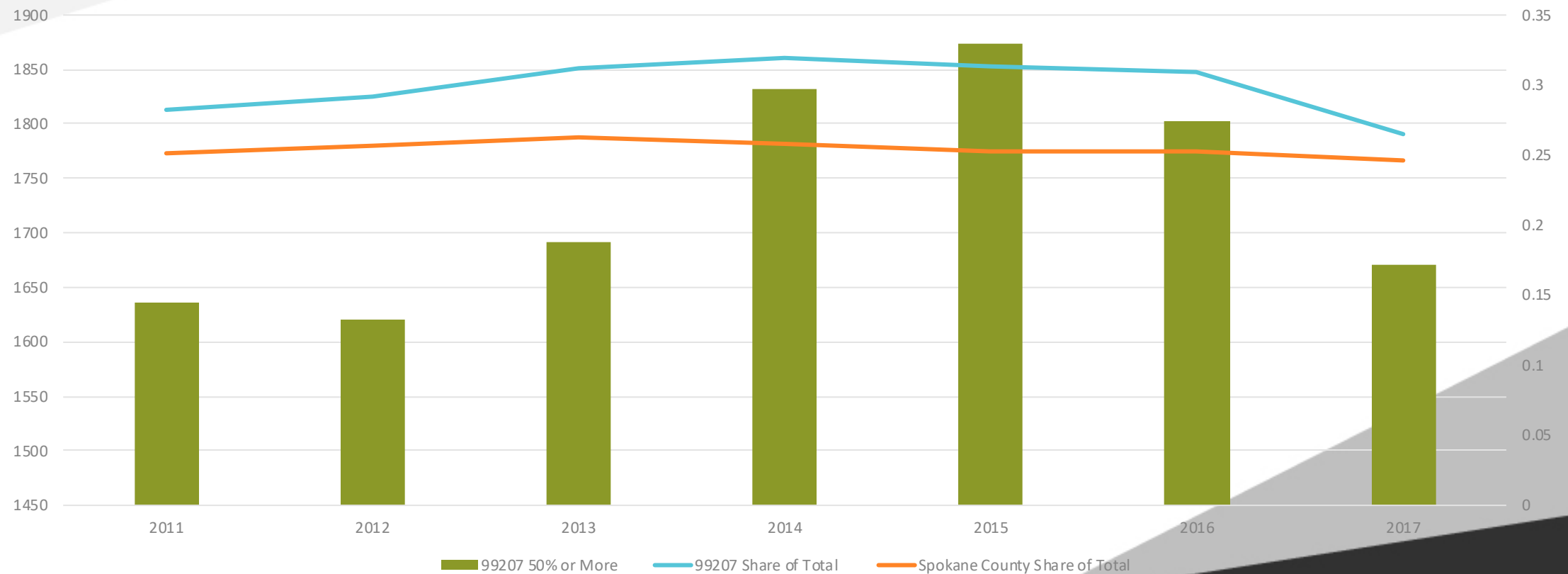
Total and Share of Renters Paying 30% or More of Their Household Income for Shelter Costs



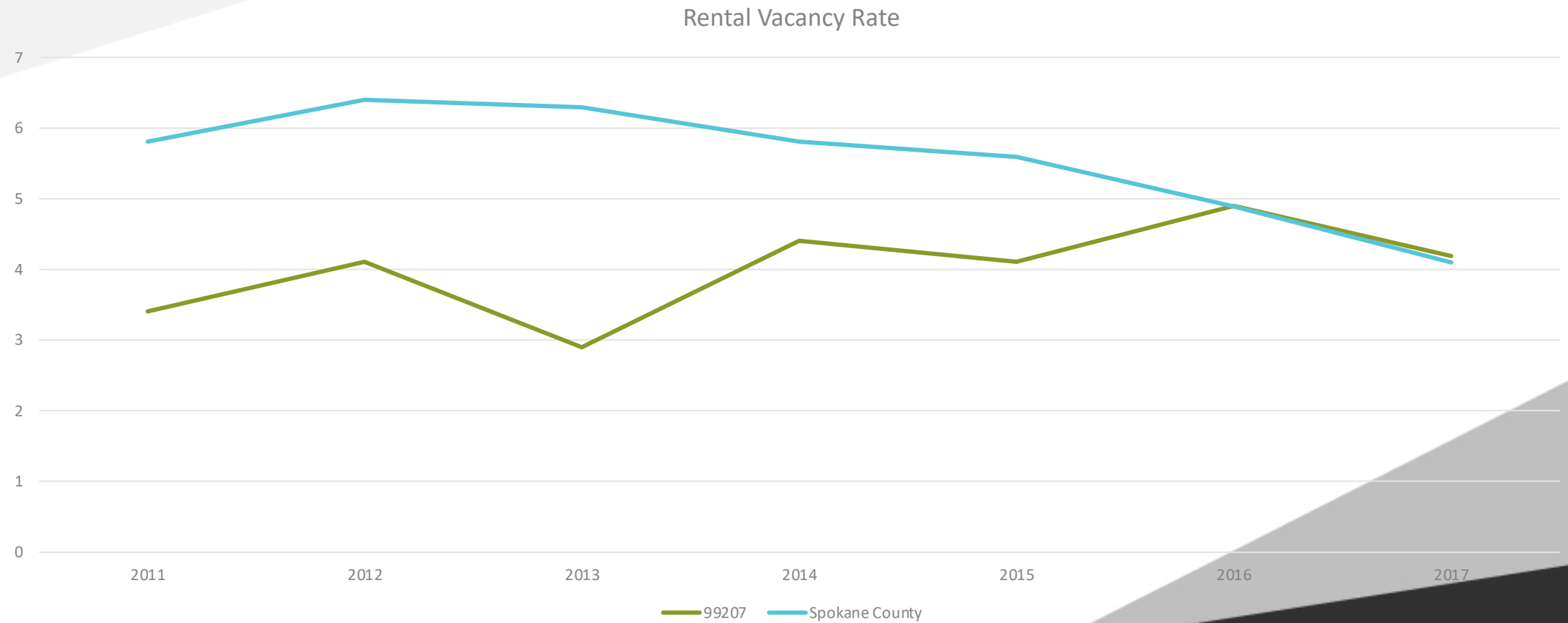

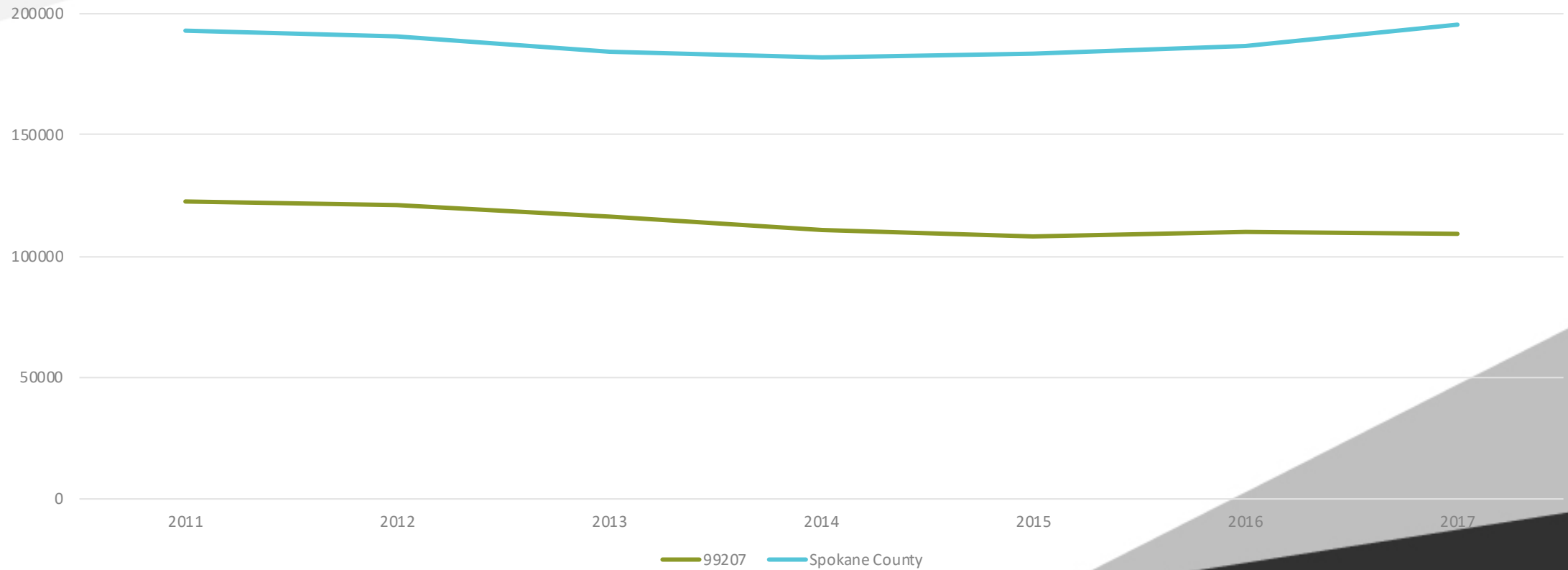

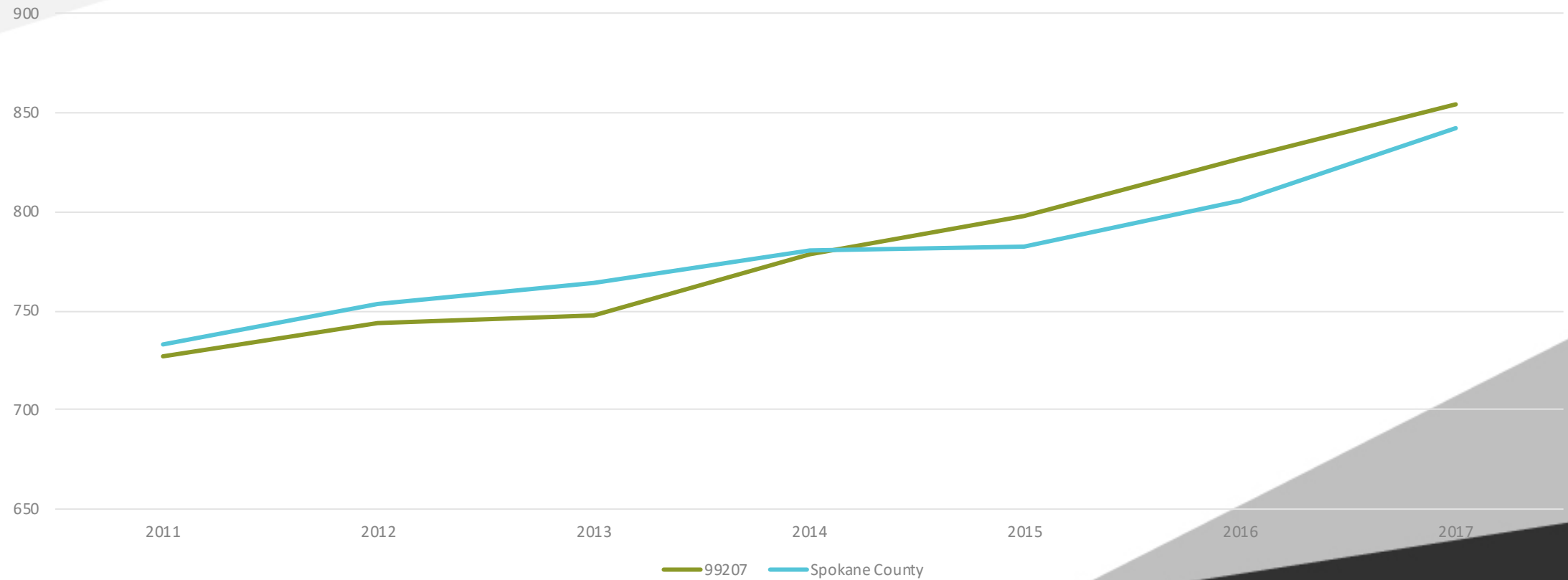

Median Gross Rent for Occupied Units Paying Rent



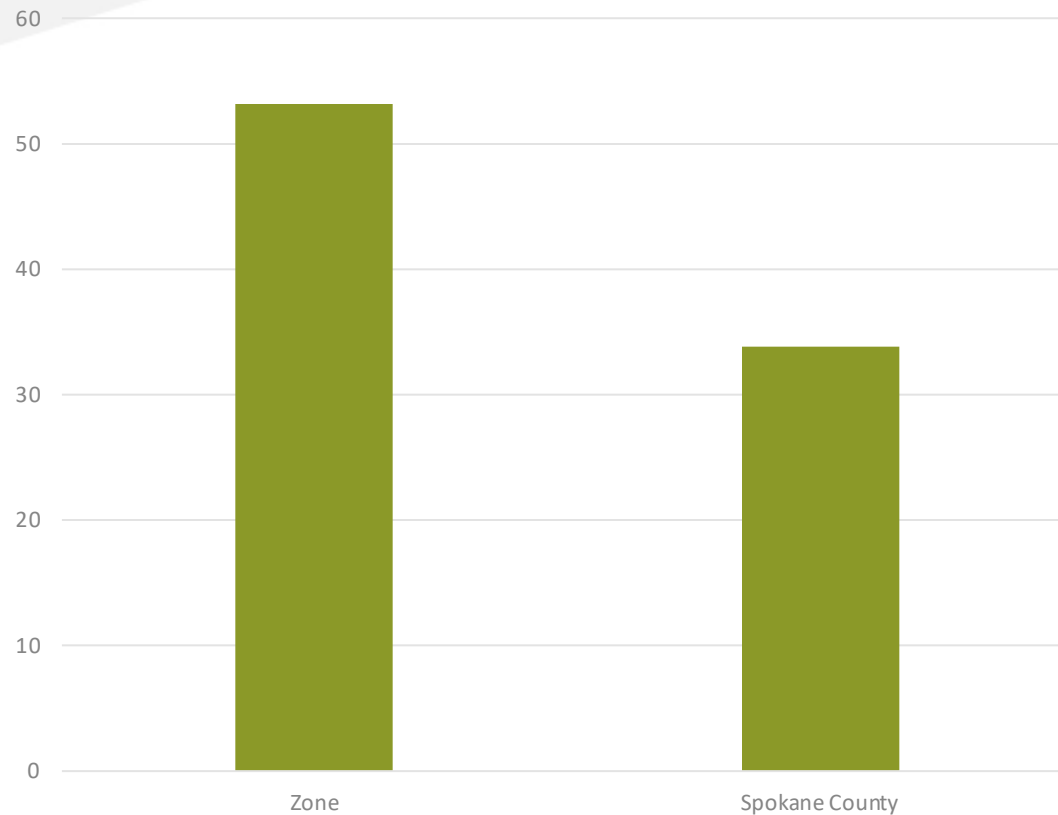

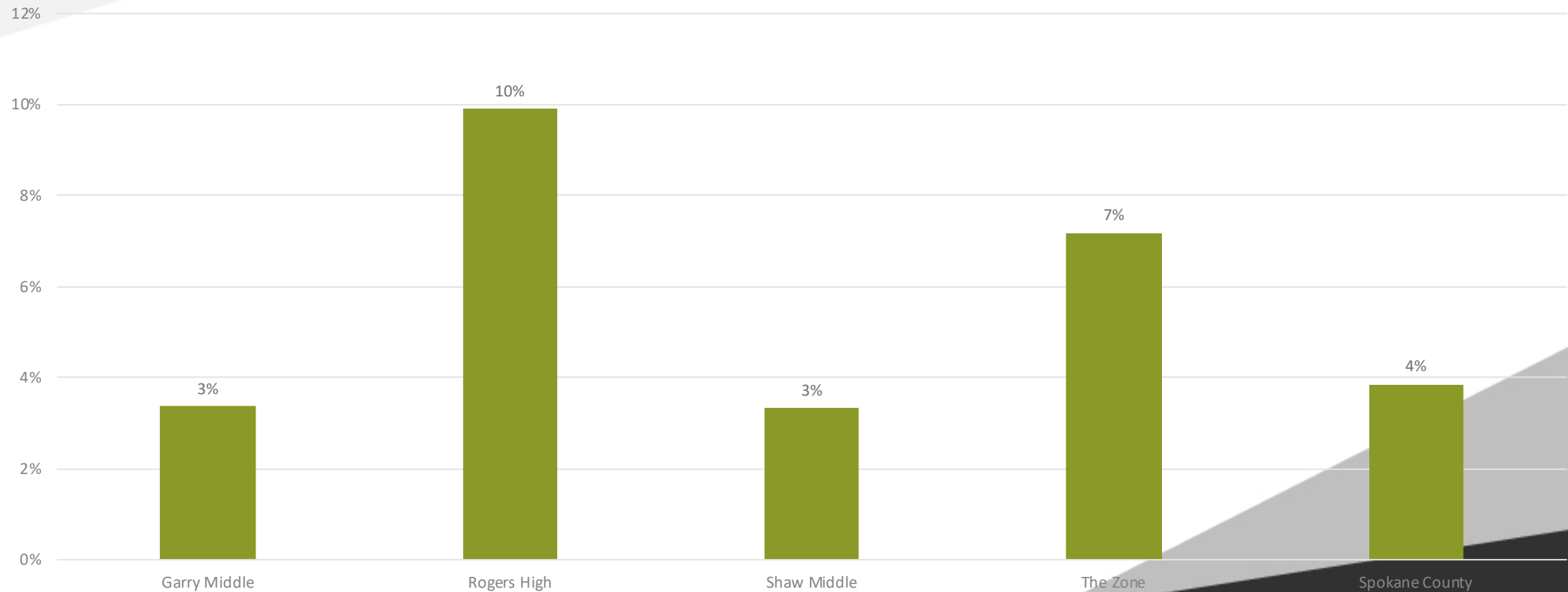

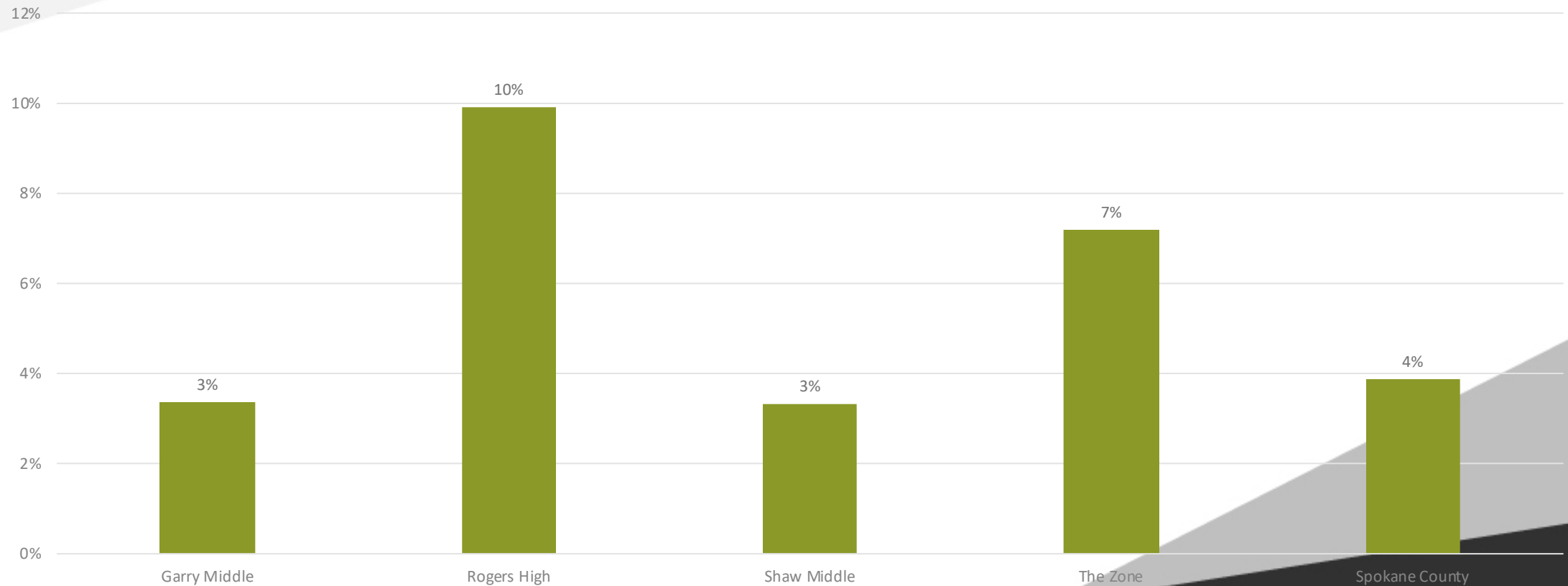

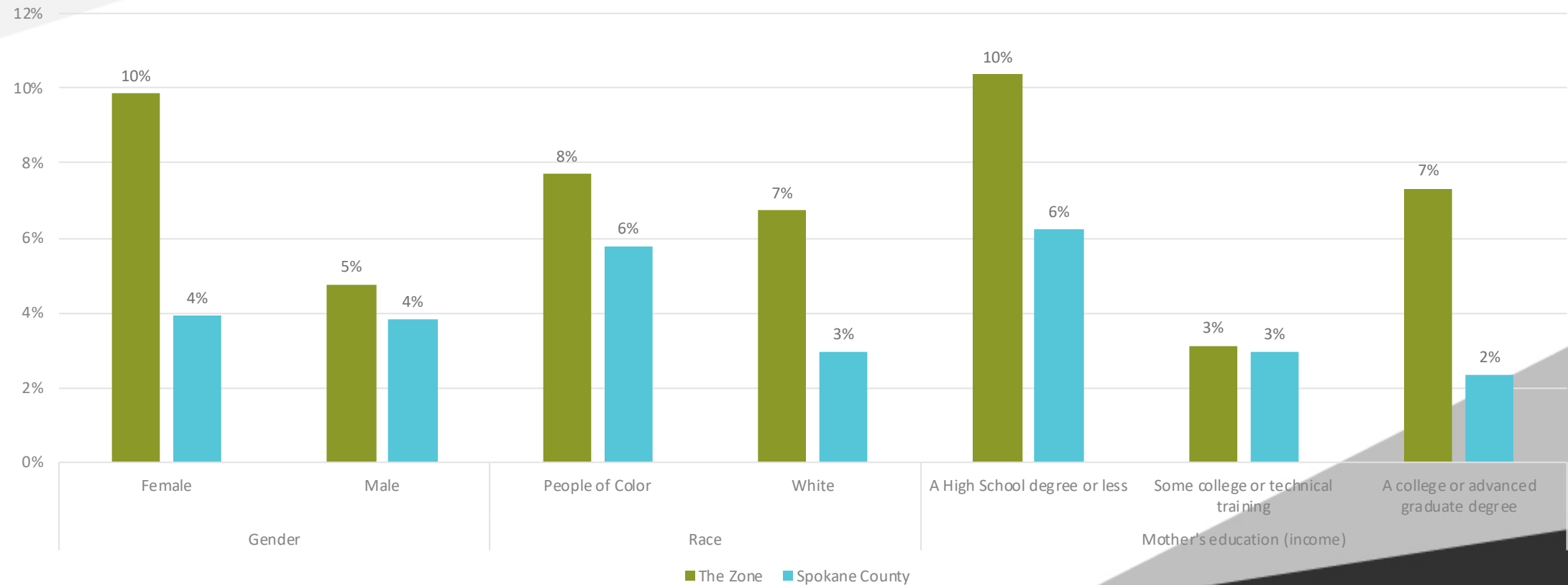

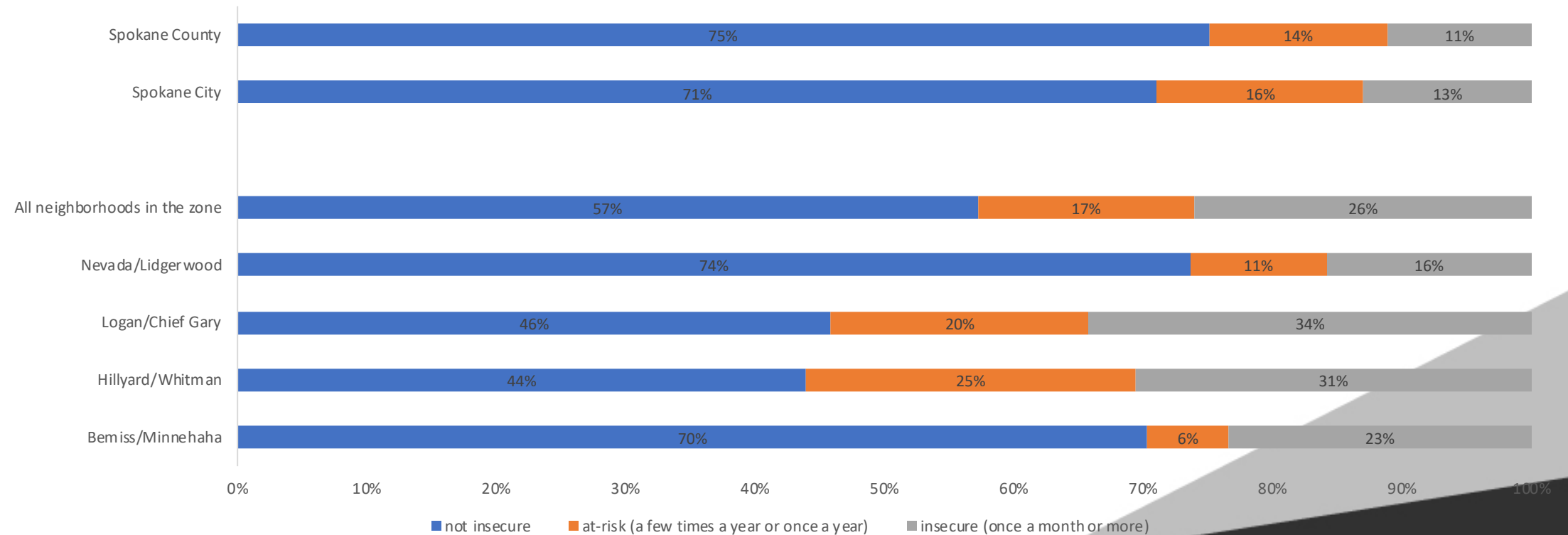

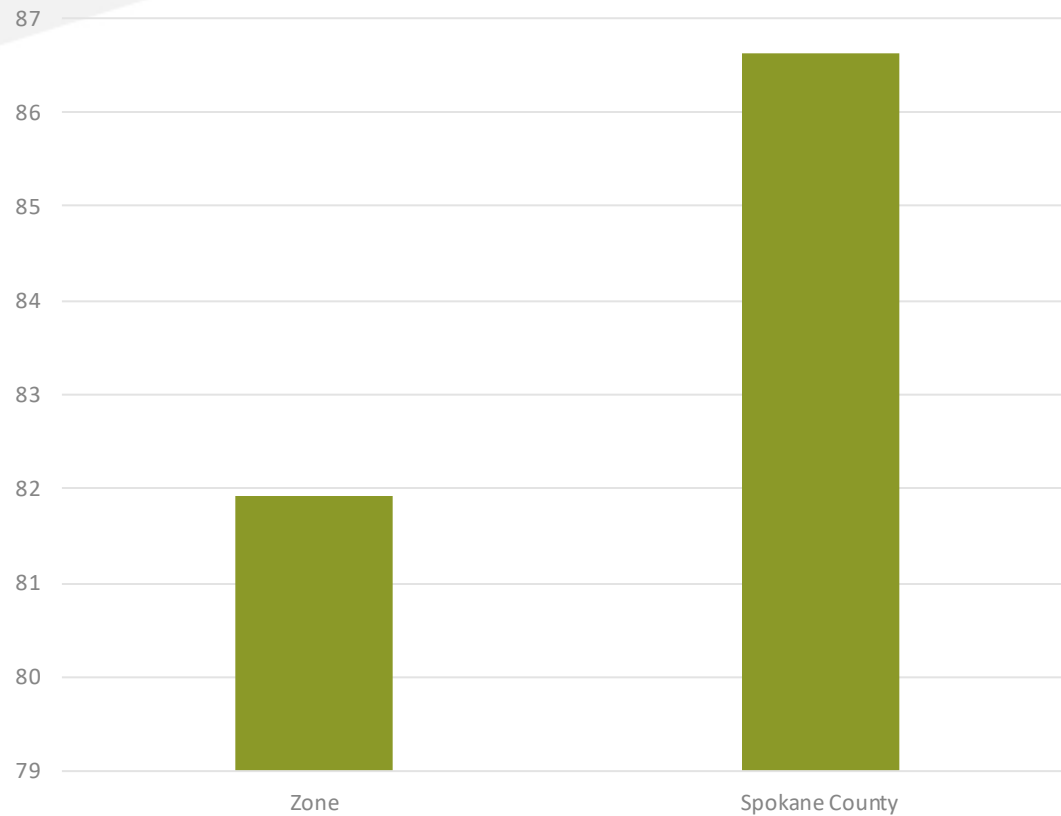

Total and Share Public Transportation Commuter



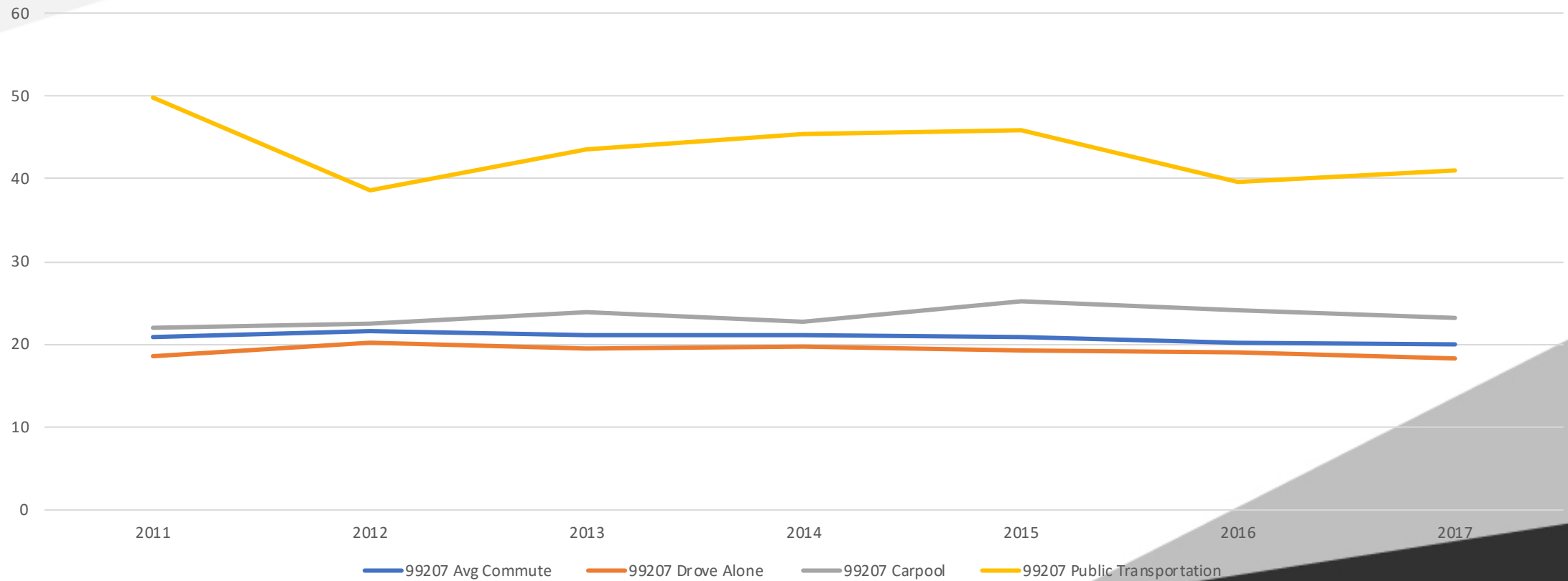

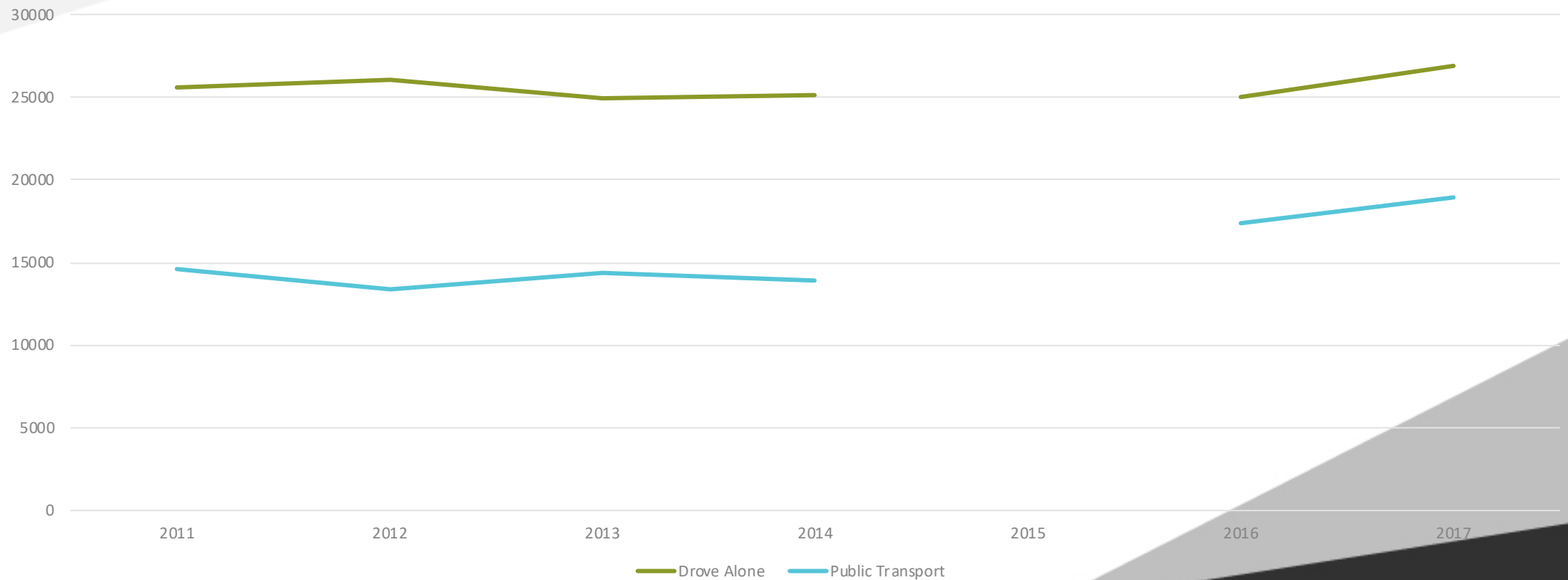
Average Commute Time by Mode





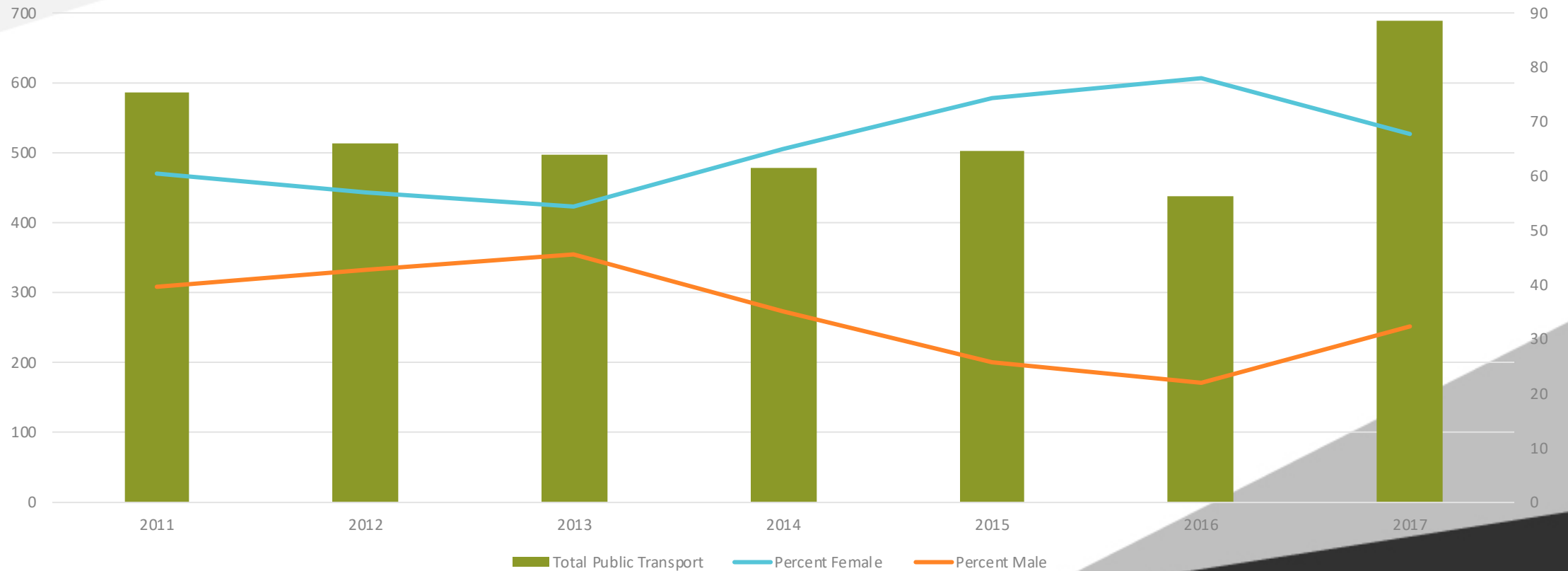

Median Earnings of Workers Age 16+ by Means of Transportation to Work

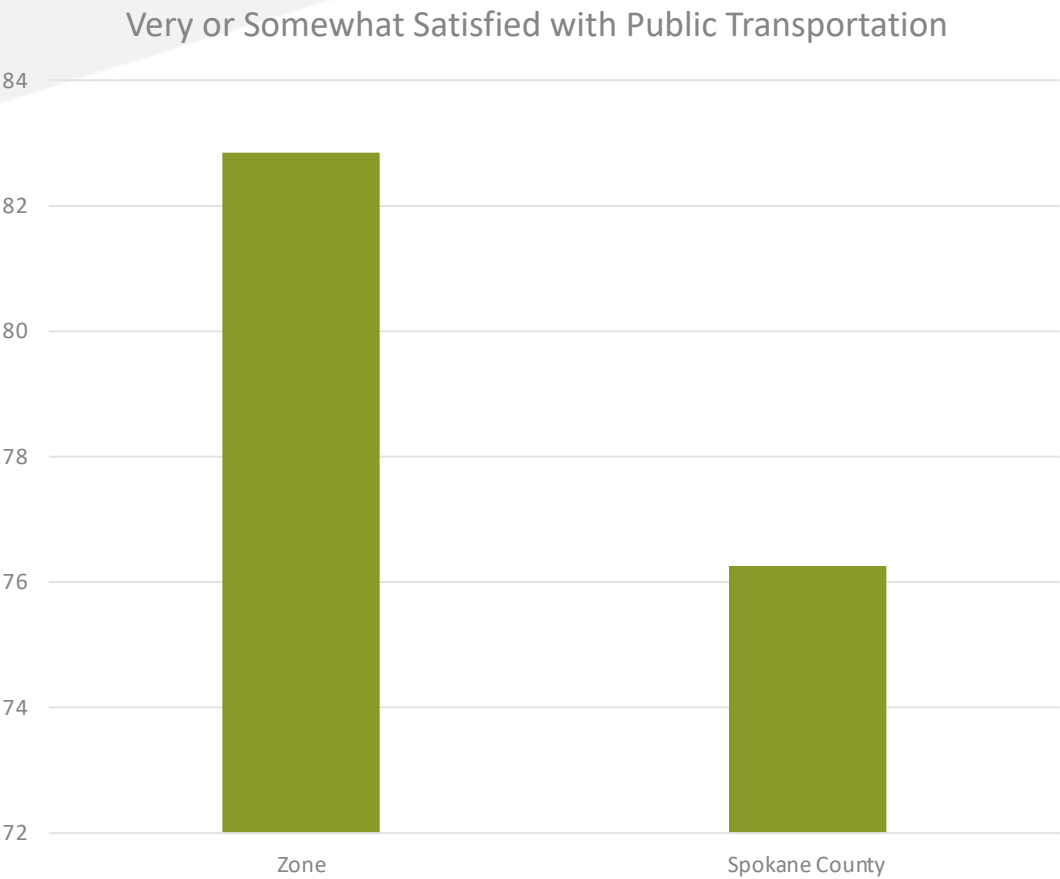

Feel Very or Somewhat Safe Using Local Park or Green Space Alone During Day



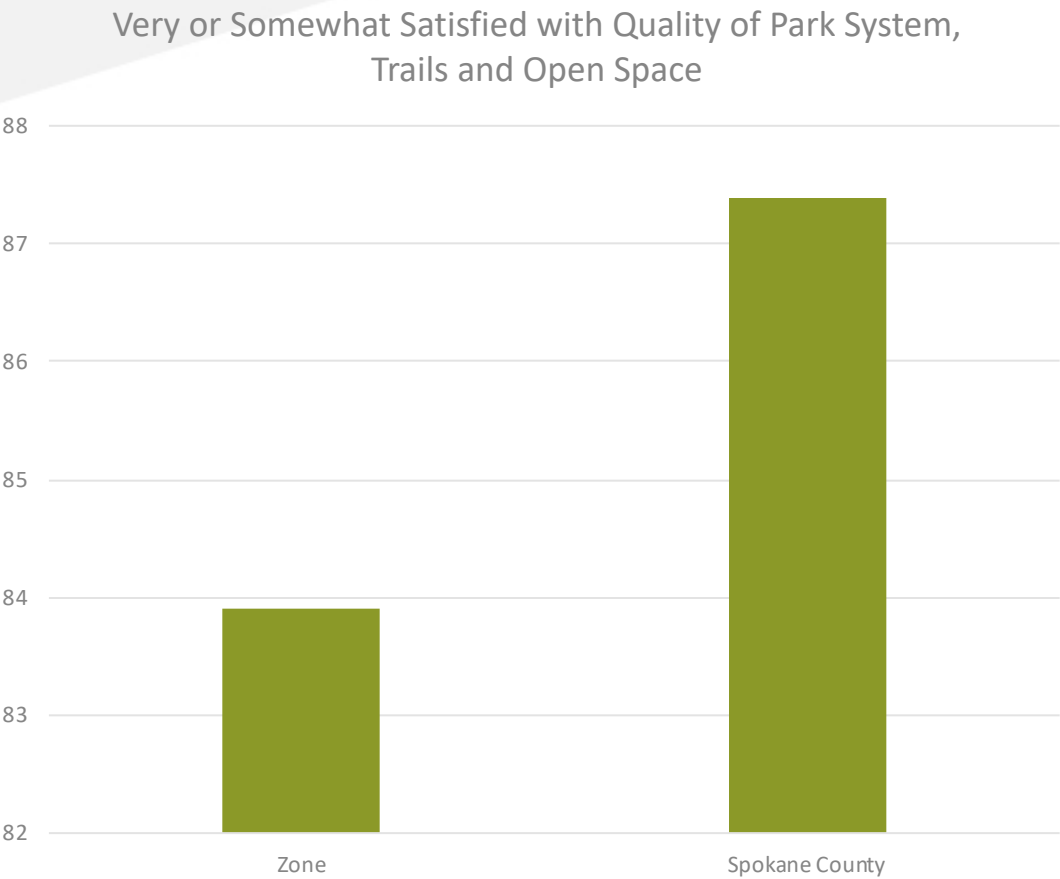
